FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Why do we bother going to church on Sundays anymore? So much has changed in the last fifty to one hundred years that perhaps Sunday worship services are simply outdated. Is that why YOU don't come every week?

Sixty years ago, church was the place where you saw other people. It was as much for the social aspect as for worshipping God. The Luther League met once a month and nobody missed because you got to hang out with your friends. But think of what has changed since that time.

For the youth back then, when it came to sports, you had one varsity football game a week, but besides that, you didn't really have a lot of opportunities to see your friends outside of school. Even calling someone cost a lot of long distance charges. Nowadays, we have sports every night of the week and on the weekends. You can stay connected to their friends on Snapchat, Instagram, Facebook and through texting 24/7 as well. And every single member of the family has a car so it is NOT difficult to go somewhere if you want. In the sixties, families usually had ONE car for the whole family. Maybe you played card club with your neighbors once a month. The point is, are we surprised that church isn't a social outlet for people anymore? We don't need church for that.

People used to come to church for the weekly sermon. The pastor was the local expert on theology. But think about how much has changed. Let's face it, if you want to hear a REALLY good sermon, the best place to go would be YouTube or somewhere else on the internet. You can hear the BEST of the BEST anytime you want and NOT just on a Sunday morning. The best praise team songs are on the radio 24/7 as well! And if you have a question about faith? Why wait to talk to your pastor when you could simply look it up on the internet. You could find fifty different opinions and pick the one you like! Church isn't the only place we can learn about theology.

Today, people are so busy that Sunday morning seems like the ONLY free day of the week. So we set it aside for our families, or for sleep, or to catch up on work. It's the day of REST, right? God said that, right? Sixty years ago, there was just a lot more time to devote to church if you wanted to. Seventy percent of Americans were married (compared to 51% today) and most of those families had only ONE working parent and owned their own home! You rested on Saturday and went to church on Sunday. Nowadays, everyone has activities all day for their kids on Saturdays, drive to a movie in Des Moines that night, and come home so late that nobody even

CONSIDERS setting an alarm to get ready for church.

So, why bother with church? You don't need it for the social time, you can encourage your faith through other avenues and who has time to go anyway!?

God commanded us, "Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy." Holy means "set apart". Early Christians celebrated the Sabbath on Sunday (instead of Saturday) to set them apart from their Jewish brothers and sisters. This day was set apart, not for rest from God, but for rest FROM EVERYTHING ELSE! Worshipping God on Sunday morning is supposed to be a break from the rest of your life! Every other day of the week, you HAVE to go to work, or you HAVE to go to school or you HAVE to drive an hour to a five hour tournament or else your kid loses their spot on the team. Sundays are different because you have CHOSEN to be a follower of Christ. No one is going to punish you if you miss, but most people who attend worship every

every week say that if they miss church, even for ONE week, their week just doesn't feel right. They are MISSING something important.

I can admit, as your pastor, that you can probably find several sermons online that are better than mine. I will also bet that NONE of you are listening to one every week. You COULD, but you probably DON'T. God wants us to set apart a day of the week to be challenged to grow in our faith, to reflect on our sins, confess them and commit to repenting of those sins, to be comforted in our difficulties and encouraged to trust in God when life seems out of control.

While you don't need a church for social activity, the church is the place where you can find spiritual support. People who will care for you in a way that you won't find other places. People who have committed to the same purpose that you have committed to. People who care whether they see you every week or not. In the past, when somebody missed church, the people around them called and made sure they were alright. Nowadays we have just gotten out of the habit because we just don't expect people to come every week! We don't FEEL like a community because members of the team are always MISSING. We just don't feel connected anymore.

I find it interesting that so many people believe that the church is outdated. That we don't need it, or faith or God anymore. We are too advanced for all of that. Too busy. But worshipping God has been the single most important aspect of faith life for over 2000 years! God sent down a specific command with Moses several thousand years before THAT even! Yes, many things have changed, but the command is the same and the need is that same.

Please come to worship God EVERY Sunday that you can. Bring your family. Bring your children. That's how we build a community that cares about each other and that focuses on sharing God's love with others. It's how we learn about God and one another. Church is NEVER going to be at the perfect time or on the perfect day or with the perfect pastor, but God has commanded us that if we want to follow Him, remembering the Sabbath by keeping it holy is the best way to do that. Question: What does it mean that we believe in one, holy, catholic church?

At both services, every week, we confess the Apostles Creed together. But we do it differently. At the Contemporary service, we say that we believe in one holy **Christian** church and in the Traditional service we believe in one holy **catholic** church. What is the difference?

Truthfully, there isn't a difference. We are confessing the same thing. The word "catholic" (lower case "c") isn't referring to the Roman Catholic (upper case "C") church, but to the "universal" church.

Remember that before Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation, there was only ONE kind of church. It was a church that had congregations all over the world. All the people at these churches were connected by their faith in Jesus Christ. The word used to express this universal connection was the word "catholic". But its headquarters was in Rome, in Vatican City, with the pope, who was considered the leader of the universal catholic church. This is where the term the Roman Catholic church comes from. Even though Lutherans don't recognize the pope as being the head of the church any longer, we believe that we are still connected to ALL other Christians around the world no matter what denomination they belong to. So we still believe in the "catholic" church, the universal church, the church full of Christians no matter where they are in the world.

The reason that the Contemporary service uses the word "Christian" instead of "catholic" is because most people DON'T know the history of this word. It is confusing. Saying "Christian" makes it clear that we are connected to all other Christians without having to explain. But after you have grown up saying the word "catholic" for fifty or sixty years, it feels awkward to say it differently so it is just the traditional way to say it. The hardest part for me, as the pastor, is to remember which service I am at so that I say it correctly!

So no matter whether you say "Christian" or "catholic" you are saying the same thing. We believe that no matter what language we speak, what service we attend, where we live in the world or what denomination we are affiliated with, we are part of the Body of Christ and are brothers and sisters in the family of God. We share the same faith and worship the same Lord. We support one another and pray for one another. We are believers in Jesus Christ who died for the world and loves us all. Amen.

To all members and prospective members:

In a troubled world where we feel that God's word, and His law, seems to be up for negotiation and compromise, we feel the need to again turn to our Father and his word to help guide us.

Our council has felt the need to reaffirm the principles, morals, and attitudes that God's word has set for us and that we all desire to follow. The council would like to reinforce those values for those who wish to serve in leadership roles, *especially* those that influence our youth.

The purpose is not to accuse or to judge anyone. We all sin. No sin is greater than another sin. Despite our best efforts, we all fail. **BUT, by God's grace, we can be, and are forgiven *if we repent, and strive to improve our lives.***

The purpose is for each of us to evaluate ourselves as we think about serving God and his people, whether at home, in the community or within the church. We need leaders who are willing to be examples for all, old and young.

The council encourages all to attend worship and learn of God's grace but also feel that leaders are called to a higher standard.

The following is a result of searching God's word in the Holy Bible, LCMC principles, other congregation's principles, and many discussions. The council would like the congregation to consider and adopt the following at our semi-annual meeting scheduled for **Sunday, July 15th at 1 p.m., following a church potluck lunch.**

Leadership at Emmanuel Lutheran Church

Serving in leadership is a significant ministry opportunity and is important to the overall health and vitality of our congregation. Since leadership is such an important function, leaders (staff positions included) ought to have present, at least in some degree in their lives, the characteristics that are outlined in Scripture.

See for example, I Timothy 3:1-4, 6-7, Titus 1:6-9, 1 Peter 5:1-4, and Galatians 5:16-26.

The council has defined the following roles at Emmanuel Luther Church as leadership roles:

- The Pastor
- Council Members
- Worship Team Leaders*
- Sunday School/Grow Teachers and Helpers
- Bible School Teachers and Helpers
- Praise Team Members and Organist
- Ministry Team Leaders
- Stephens Ministers

*The Worship Team Leaders would include Communion Assistants and Readers.

(the following is adopted and edited from the Lutheran Church of the Cross, Altoona, IA)

The Scriptural characteristics of leaders are identified as the following:

- Overall spiritual maturity* -Is a mature Christian
- Above reproach* -Has a good Christian reputation, among believers and non-Christians
- Marital Faithfulness* -Is faithful to their spouse. If single, living a chaste life
- Temperate* -Maintains balance in their Christian experience
- Prudent* -Is wise and discerning
- Respectable* -Their life is a good reflection of the life of Jesus Christ
- Hospitable* -Is generous
- Able to teach* -Communicates well, even to those with whom they may disagree
- Not addicted to wine* -Controls obsessions and compulsions
- Not self-willed* -Relates well to other people without being self-centered and controlling
- Not quick-tempered* -Controls anger
- Not pugnacious* -Does not commit any form of verbal or physical abuse
- Gentle* -Is objective and fair-minded in relationships with others
- Uncontentious* -Avoids getting into arguments

Leadership at Emmanuel Continue...

Free from the love of money -Is not materialistic

One who manages his/her own household well -Functions within their family according to God's plan

Loving what is good -Overcomes evil with good

Just -Is just and fair in their relationships with others

Devout -Life reflects God's holiness

Disciplined -Lives a disciplined Christian life

Leaders can slip and fall in the mud (see for example King David, Paul, Peter and even Judas). *What leaders do next is the big question.* There are many options. Someone after making a mistake can stand up, laugh about the stupidity, take a shower and carry on. Someone else may recognize the pain and hurt, the dirt in the eyes, stand up, take a shower and then carry on. Another, crawl up out of the mud, say little, hope that no one saw a thing, take a shower and carry on. **These are all acceptable. Leaders must not sit in the mud and pretend that they are not muddy, pretend that they did not fall, or pretend that it is not mud. Further, we must not try to convince ourselves that the mud is good.**

When we sin, and we all sin, every Christian simply needs to acknowledge the sin, repent and live under God's forgiveness and grace, and carry on. There is nothing that can separate us from God's love in Christ Jesus – especially when we fall and make mistakes. Sometimes there are consequences for our mistakes. But our standing with God is never in doubt, never in question.

Grief Share

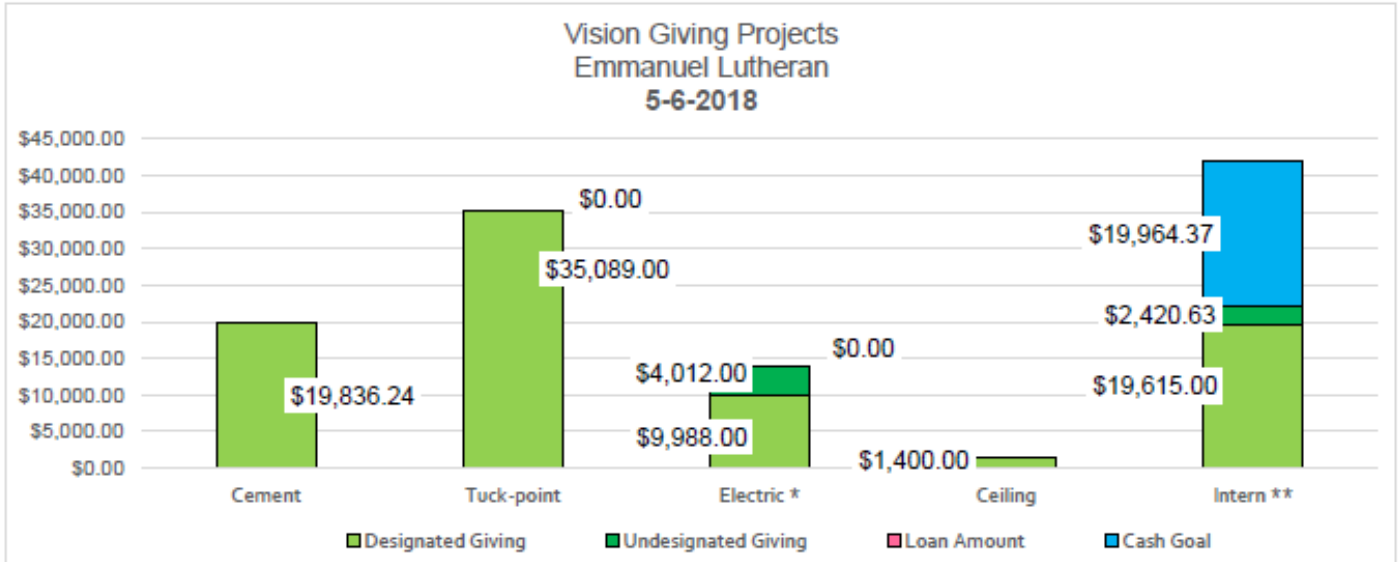
