

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As I was reading through the book of Jeremiah, I came across a little story about a group of people called The Recabites. The patriarch of this group of people, Jonadab, told his family, "Neither you nor your descendants must ever drink wine. Also you must never build houses, sow seed or plant vineyards; you must never have these things, but must always live in tents. Then you will live a long time in the land where you are nomads." The story goes on to say that Jonadab's family did exactly what they were told. Later on in the story, God speaks through the prophet Jeremiah, "Will you not learn a lesson and obey my words? I have spoken to you again and again, yet you have not obeyed me." (Jeremiah 35)

Do you think that this story is about the dangers of drinking wine? No. Is it a story about keeping people out of the real estate markets and from becoming farmers? Obviously not. Are we all supposed to live in tents? No. It's a story about listening. God used this example of a family following the orders of a father in order to show how frustrating it is that God's people don't follow what God tells us to do.

I think about the Recabites and wonder, "Didn't *somebody* in the family want to drink wine?" Of course! But being respectful of the father, or grandfather, was *more* important. Wasn't it a sacrifice to not drink wine? Or to live in tents rather than in houses? Yes, I'm sure it was. But these sacrifices were not as important as expressing their love through obedience. Jesus once said, "If you love me, keep my commands." (John 14:15) But, just like with Jonadab, when God gives us commands to follow there will also be sacrifices involved.

Sometimes commands make sense (ex. You shall not murder) and it will be *easy* to follow that guideline. Killing people seems wrong to most people and cultures. Other times you may *not* understand why a particular

rule is put in place (ex. Remember the Sabbath Day and keep it holy). Maybe you just want a day to sleep in and you figure, as long as you love God and have faith in Him, what's the big deal about going to church? But God just expects us to *listen* and *respect* His commands. Our obedience shows our love for Him.

It seems like people nowadays just can't stand the idea of sacrifice. Everybody wants to be able to do whatever they want without any consequences. The idea that as a Christian you wouldn't be able to do something that someone else can do is almost unthinkable! But from the very beginning, God has wanted His people to be different from the norm. He calls His people, "holy" or "sanctified" throughout various parts of the Bible. It may not always make sense to you why God commands Christians to live a certain way; in fact, you might actually disagree! But is it really surprising that you think differently than God? And isn't it rather prideful to think you know better than God? And, for that matter, isn't the reward of a heavenly home worth sacrificing something sometimes?

There are some things that I will never experience in this lifetime. I have never gotten drunk and I have never taken drugs. For some people, they might argue that I am really missing out. Maybe. But I am willing to accept that, as a Christian, in order to please God I might not have every experience available to me in this world. In fact, I think that there are some positive consequences to living a different kind of life. If somebody finds out you are a Christian, they might treat you differently. It's true. You could hide the fact if you want, or you can just be yourself and take the risk that others might not like you sometimes for what you believe. It's okay! Sometimes there are sacrifices to be made in life and that includes some sacrifices involved with being a Christian.

The Power of Prayer. By Vicar Tony

28 "Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, and he brought them out of their distress.
29 He stilled the storm to a whisper; the waves of the sea were hushed.
30 They were glad when it grew calm, and he guided them to their desired haven."
(Psalm 107:28-30 NIV)

Relationships are established and maintained by communicating. We ask questions, and answer questions of each other. We can tell others about how our day has been or what we are going through. We may complain or express our gratitude. Sometimes we may ask others to help us do something or handle a situation. Negotiating is a form of communicating that requires a compromise regarding issues. Abraham had a very favorable result when he negotiated with God regarding the city of Sodom. We may be facing a crisis and need advice to solve the problem, so we talk to a friend. This is the way and the reasons humans communicate with each other. This is the same way we can talk with God.

Talking to God includes praying to the Father, the Son, or the Holy Spirit. Keep in mind that prayer is for us, to remind us, give us peace of mind, express gratitude, and provide courage. Jesus considered prayer to be so important that He prayed frequently. It is believed His prayers were in the form of the Psalms. Like wish, He also taught us how to pray, The Lord's Prayer. Martin Luther wrote much about praying and expressed the importance by instructing households on how to pray. There are many popular written prayers that we can use as resources, such as the Prayer attributed to St. Francis. You can also pray the Creeds, and there are many prayers in the front of the Lutheran Book of Worship, the green LBW. But most importantly we can use our own words when talking to God.

St. Paul tells us that we should be praying all the time and everywhere. "¹⁶ Rejoice always, ¹⁷ pray continually," (1Th 5:16-17 NIV) Basically, this means that we should be focused on God in all that we do. Reminding ourselves that all this, all that we have, all that we can do is because of God's love and compassion for us.

Our prayers do not have to be long nor very elaborate, a simple "Thank you Jesus," can be meaningful. Jesus warns about long prayers, "And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words." (Mat 6:7 NIV)

God knows our thoughts, needs, and what's in our hearts; but when we say outwardly what is inside us we make the feelings more real. Prayer changes us as well as situations. The act of repetitive prayer can motivate us or help us realize to take a new perspective on the issues at hand. Therefore, we must still our minds, wait and listen for God to respond giving us an answer.

Jesus taught us that there are rewards for prayer from Matthew, "But, when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." (Mat 6:6 NIV

The reasons for praying to God are many, such as, giving thanks, praise, confessing, as well as requesting something for ourselves or others. Unfortunately, too many people are not satisfied unless they get the answer that they want. In the Scriptures, "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." (Mat 7:7-8 NIV) These verses give the impression that God answers all prayers affirmatively, and He does. But in the Father's time and the response will be what He considers to be in our best interest.

Think of it as "Father knows best."

In the movie "Evan Almighty" Evan's wife is in a restaurant leaving her husband because everybody thinks he is crazy for building an ark. Morgan Freeman, as God, tells her, "when a person prays for courage, does God just give that person courage or does He give that person an opportunity to be courageous?" God cannot influence "free will" nor can He just give us everything we want. Life would be a total bore. In the first "Almighty" movie "Bruce Almighty," Bruce was given God's powers by Morgan Freeman. Bruce wanted to satisfy everyone, and he gave them what they wanted. For example, to win the lottery. The result was disastrous, everybody disapprovingly won something like one dollar.

Some people are hindered by not knowing what to pray for and they question their motives. Sometimes we can question a response we think is coming from God. When faced with these questions the best source is to go to the Bible. If our intended actions conform with the writings in the Bible, then we are good ground. The Scriptures are the main and reliable method that God talks to us. The Bible is the foundation of our understanding of God and why God wants us to be happy. It is because God Loves us.

It is God's love that will fill our hearts by prayer. When baby Jesus came into this world as the incarnate Word of God, He gifted us with Faith, Hope, Love and Peace. When Jesus died on the cross, He gifted us with the forgiveness of our sins giving us salvation and everlasting life with Him. "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." (Joh 15:13 NIV)

Pray often, be patient, let God be in control and...

⁶ "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Amen
