FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Summer is here! School is almost out for the youth. The pool is opening. Temperatures are increasing and the crops are (hopefully!) planted by now and are growing. There might be more free time to play or work in the yard or clean your house. We feel summer in the church as well now that GROW and Confirmation classes are done. The church calendar looks a little more empty than it usually does and, unfortunately, many times the pews at church are a little less crowded as well due to vacations and a change in people's schedules. I have been thinking of two different scripture passages that might help you decide what to do with your summer this year.

First, Ecclesiastes chapter 3:1, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven." Throughout the school year, parents are often very busy racing their children to activities and games. Farmers are busy either with harvest or planting. It just feels like there is *never* enough time to get everything done because, well, there usually isn't! But summer just *feels* a little more open and a little more free. You might feel like relaxing and maybe not getting as much done as you could. Spending time with friends, grilling out or having a nice vacation. Enjoying the sun's rays each and every day!

I want to encourage you to take the time to relax. Be a little less rigid with your schedule and enjoy this season. Spend a little more time with your family even though you *could* keep working. The summer is a time that we can all refresh and destress but only if you allow yourself to *enjoy* it. You will have to hit the books, put your nose to the grindstone or run around like a chicken with your head cut off soon enough—that season will be here before

you know it—but God has given you this time to do other things or maybe to do nothing at all! This was part of the reason God made a Sabbath, a time to rest, as part of each week.

But the Sabbath rest wasn't only created to help us to refrain from work, but to reconnect with God. This brings me to the second passage I have been thinking about. Psalm 1, "But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on His law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers." Summer can also be a season to grow in your relationship to God, His Word and to your Christian community. To become closer to the Son of God, Jesus Christ.

Throughout the year, you may be so busy that you feel that you need Sundays just to sleep in, catch up on your work and recuperate. Summer is different. This might be a wonderful time to get into the habit of regular church attendance and see how your life is changed. Just like crops grow well in the summer with the nourishing rays of the sun and cool rains for moisture, your faith life might really become strengthened by hearing God's Word regularly, hearing preaching to help you apply it to your daily life and get reconnected to other faithful followers at church. Summer can be a time for growth in your faith just as it is for the plants and animals outside.

I pray that this summer season is a blessing for you and your family. I pray that it helps strengthen your mind, body and spirit. Take time to relax. Take time to recuperate and enjoy some downtime. Finally, take time to grow in your faith with God. It's a great opportunity to enjoy the sun and the Sun! Amen.

Children's Ministry:

GROW

First Communion Training began in March for those in 5th grade. There were 7 students who received their First Communion on Palm Sunday.

GROW is returning to the normal 7:30 PM dismissal time during Holy Week.

The GROW kids had \$543.34 of unspent offering over the past 2 years. The 3rd & 4th graders decided to use that money for a Flock of Hope (\$60), Rabbits (\$60), Bees (\$30), Gardeners Gift Basket (\$170), and Llamas (\$150) through Heifer International totaling \$470. They will use the remaining \$73.34 plus the offering given this year for another Heifer International gift of their choosing.

Stephen's Ministry by Vicar Tony

Stephen Ministries is a not-for-profit religious organization, founded by Rev. Dr. Kenneth Haugk in St. Louis MO, 1975. While a pastor and clinical psychologist, he recognized a great need for care that exceeded his ability to provide. He decided to train nine individuals to establish a "caring ministry," with the vision of "Christ caring for people through people." The initial success spread to other congregations and the program grew rapidly.

The program is specifically designed to equip the laity of a congregation in reaching out to those people that can benefit by talking with a caring person. Over the years the organization has grown to be a part of thirteen thousand congregations. It has also grown in providing hundreds of books, reference material, supportive, and resources. It also provides training classes not only for the lay ministers directly serving people, facilitators leading group supervision as well as leaders to train new ministers.

The mission of Stephen Ministries is adopted from Ephesians 4:11-13, *So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.* (Eph. 4:11-13 NIV)

St. Paul calls everyone in the church a saint and this doctrine was adopted by Martin Luther. This term carries the meaning that all Christians are called into Christ's ministry and that you as a caregiver are valued by God. Giving aid and comfort to an ailing person is a service that is impactful for the person receiving the care, but it is also rewarding to the caregiver as well. We are all bonded together as one within the Body of Christ. Therefore, when one part is hurting the entire body suffers. But when we pull together and help each other the body becomes stronger and "may be built up."

In verse 11 we read the words "apostles," "pastors and teachers." We treat them as separate people with different functions. But in fact, they are one group "united in faith." We are all apostles sent out to do God's work on earth. We are all pastors in the sense of the word meaning that we are all shepherds caring for each other. We are all teachers to others sharing God's word and spreading the Good News.

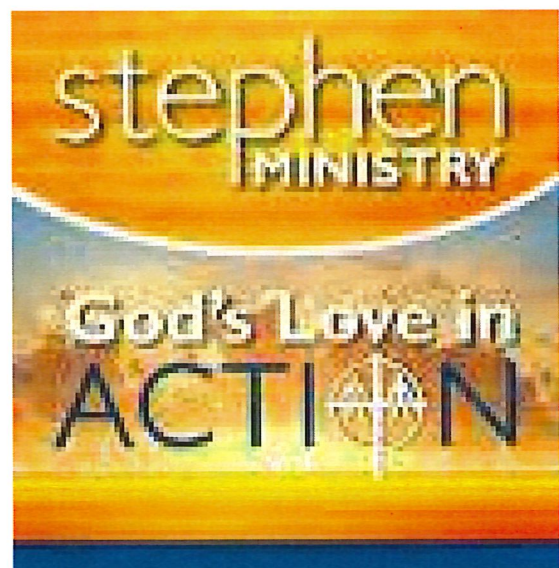
By taking on these characteristics we become more Christ-like. When we look at the New Testament with a broad stroke of the brush, we are being guided to acquire the behaviors of Christ and providing healing and comfort to each other. Stephen Ministers encourage people who struggle in body, mind and spirit to center themselves on Christ and rely on Christ for healing.

Everyone has experienced times when we are scattered, confused or lost in the overwhelming trials and tribulations of life in this broken world. The Holy Spirit unifies the church, all of God's people. Stephen Ministers help bring the lives of these troubled people back into a Christ centered and comforting place. Care receivers can

find order and meaning in their lives where chaos once dominated. When we are filled with faith in our Lord Jesus Christ trusting that whatever problems we have we can bring them to the foot of His cross and He will take that burden from our shoulders and carry them Himself.

Stephen Ministers are not a licensed therapist, but they are trained for over forty hours to be there for people in need. And equip to move care receivers through their pain and suffering restoring wholeness. On occasion referring care-receivers to a profession is needed for their best interest. We are more than just physical and mental being, requiring more than just bodily and mental care. We are also spiritual beings needing spiritual care to restore us to wholeness. The church (God's people) is that safe place where that can take place when God's people grow out of isolation and into a divine community bonded by the Holy Spirit.

God's people are equipped for works of service. Stephen Ministers help people who feel worthless, unwanted and spiritually broken. The Stephen Ministry training teaches the caregivers to help those broken to see themselves as beloved people of God created by divine love and that their lives are a cherished gift from God. This is truly a valued and worthwhile program that has healed many people over the past forty-four years. There is no doubt in my mind that Stephen Ministries will help many more people in the future. Therefore I am very grateful to be part of the Stephen Ministry team at Emmanuel, but especially to have the opportunity to attend the Leadership training program in St. Louis. My prayers for our congregation are that we take the principles of Stephen Ministries and apply them to each other and into the community. We can show that Christianity is still alive, and that Christ is caring for people through people. Amen

Old Business:

Repairs have been made at the Steen Funeral Home apartment where Vicar Tony resides. Water works are being tested and Tony may be able to move back in this week (April 14-20).

New Business:

Vicar Tony has requested time off to attend Stephens Ministry Leadership training in St. Louis MO April 28-May 4. The cost is \$1754.00 plus mileage. Motion by Judi R., 2nded by Roland P. to pay \$1,000 of the expenses. Motion carried.
Pastor Broers reviewed Chapter 4—Statement of Purpose in our Constitution.
George F. reported on an insurance examiner's report of possible hazards or risks he identified with our church building and parsonage. He was from Grinnell Mutual Reinsurance which is where we have our insurance coverage. He said there were no immediate concerns but listed the following:
Fire extinguisher is needed in the parsonage.
In the church kitchen electrical outlets near the sinks need to have GFI's (Ground Fault Interrupters) to help prevent electrocution.
Church should be locked when not in use (to prevent theft and vandalism). Possibly between the hours of 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM every night. The council will check into options for door lock systems where only Pastor and designated council members would have access during those overnight hours.
These changes should be implemented by Sept. 2019.
Attendance books used during worship services. We will continue to have attendance books but will simplify the format. Pastor will also initiate "welcome cards" for all visitors to fill out and place in the collection plates as a way to identify them and follow up with a friendly contact later.

Wedding brochures:

Iris Westphal is our wedding coordinator. She presented a revised form that she will use when planning weddings which will spell out the do's and don'ts, what is expected of the wedding couple, as well as what is provided by our church, so that everything is spelled out and everyone is on the same page.

Motion by Judi R., 2nded by Iris W. to adjourn. Motion carried. We adjourned at 7:56 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

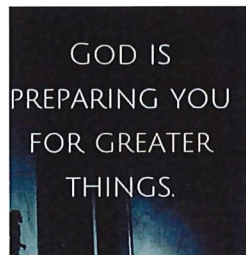


2019 8th Grade Confirmation Class

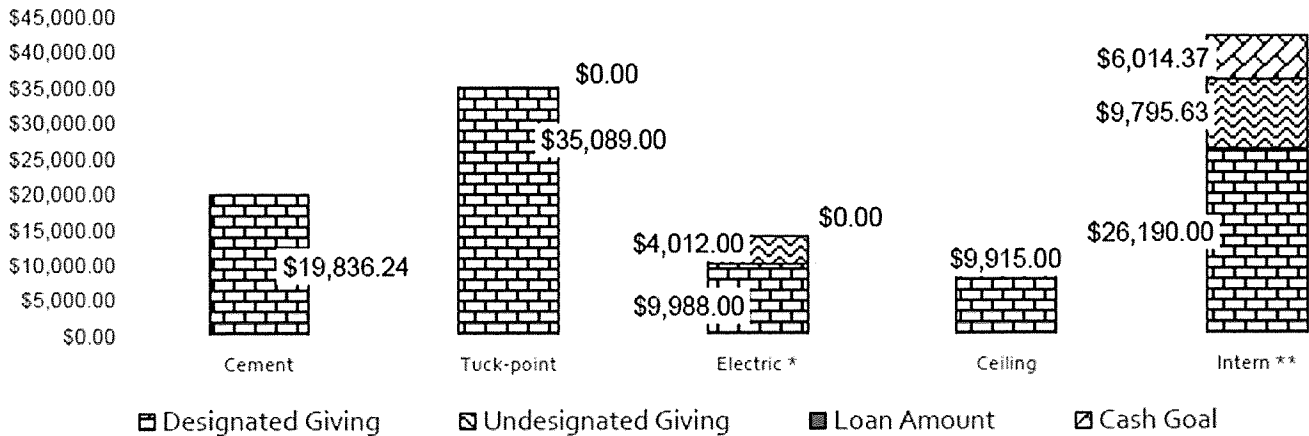
