FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I never imagined that I would be writing another newsletter article about life during a pandemic. This was never supposed to happen! I had hoped for a contemplative Lenten season followed by an exciting and uplifting Easter celebration! May was going to be filled with all kinds of special services from Mother's Day, to not believe for a second that the Covid-19 vi-Senior Recognition to Confirmation and now . . . all those plans have been cancelled. Sometimes it just feels like an alternate universe where everything got messed up. I think we need to set back our calendars to 2019 and start this year over again!

But as I was thinking about how much my plans have changed and how many of my hopes have been crushed, I started remembering a story from the Bible where other people had long ago had their hopes and dreams shattered. A couple of guys walking on the Road to Emmaus spoke to a stranger about Jesus of Nazareth who had just died, "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place." (Luke 24:19-21) Imagine how surprised these guys were when they realized that God had a plan even in the midst of such terrible circumstances! Imagine their surprise when the stranger they were explaining all of this too was Jesus! Alive again Jesus!

That Holy Week wasn't at all what these disciples had imagined or wanted. They wanted Jesus to become king and, instead, He died. They had been overjoyed the week before as they were waving palm branches, but now, they were sad and depressed. The thing is that they couldn't imagine all that God had planned nor could they see what had to happen in order for these plans to come to pass. But it was through those events that

God gave us salvation; through the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. They had their plans, but God had THE plan that overturned all of their expectations.

I know that God still has a plan in all of this drama going on in our world today. I do rus was a surprise to God. I really wish that it hadn't happened and that nobody would ever need to suffer, but I also realize that God is God and I am not. In Isaiah 55 we read, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." I can't imagine right now what life is going to look like once we can get things back to normal, but it probably won't be normal. That's the point!

Sometimes having God destroy our expectations isn't such a bad thing. Throughout the stories of the Bible, God is always surprising people or doing the exact opposite of their preconceived notions. Just when people start getting comfortable with their lives, Jesus overturns the tables and gives everyone a new perspective. I wonder how our perspectives will change once we start going back to church or to school or out to eat or to ballgames again. Will we miss normal or will we be glad that God changed everything?

Because we believe in God, we can trust that no matter how crazy this world may seem at any given time, we can trust Him to see us through. That can give us both comfort and hope no matter what the future brings. That no matter how much things change, God is the same yesterday, today and forever. Amen.

Pastor Broers gave his monthly mileage/activities report. Motion by Dan D. to approve. 2nded by Raedeen B. Carried.

Emergency Benevolence: \$350 given to a family for help with their utilities.

- Property—there has been good progress by Jerry Holan in the plaster repair work in the nave of the church.

Outreach—Pastor Broers reported that he has 28 subscribers on his Youtube videos. On Facebook Live he does bible studies every Monday at 10:00 AM for 30 minutes. He posts each production afterward for viewers to view later. From one week to the next the number of viewers increased from ~150 to ~250. He plans to do the bible studies until the middle of March, stop, and then start again on April 1st.
