EMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING

July 19, 2020

The meeting was held in the church sanctuary. Due to the coronavirus outbreak, social distancing and face masks were encouraged. Sixteen members were present.

President George Feazell called the meeting to order at 1:05 PM. Council members present were George Feazell, Matt Gross, Raedeen Bigelow, Iris Westphal, Lynn Christensen, Nellie Griffith, Roland Purdy, and Pastor Steven Broers. Absent were Dan Dreher and Bill Ernst.

Pastor Broers read opening devotions.

Motion by Craig Plymesser to adopt the Order of Business. 2nded by Roland P. Carried.

The minutes of the January 19, 2020 Annual Meeting were read by secretary, Roland P. Motion by Clella Buckner to approve the minutes. 2nded by Sherol Brown. Carried.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by George F. A 2021 budget was presented but because there was not a quorum of members present, no action was taken to approve the budget. It will need to be approved at a later date.

There was discussion on Outreach Ministry. No one is currently serving as leader for Outreach or Adult Ministries.

There was discussion on our church receiving \$20,118.53 in a forgivable loan through a government Paycheck Protection Program (or CARES Act), and \$8,000.00 through EIDL (Economic Injury Disaster Loans). These are forgivable loans available due to the coronavirus pandemic and the possible effects on church members' jobs and church giving.

Motion by Sherol Brown to approve the Treasurer's Report. 2nded by Craig Plymesser. Carried.

Old Business: Plaster Repair. Matt Gross reported that the repair work is completed except for the high-arched ceiling area and altar area in the sanctuary of the church. The coronavirus pandemic has the remaining work on hold.

New Business: 2021 Budget. Approval of the budget was postponed due to lack of a quorum.

Motion by Roland Purdy to adjourn. 2nded by Clella Buckner. Carried. We adjourned at 2:00 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

PASTOR'S REPORT

I am going to be honest: This has been a difficult year. 2020 started off with a lot of promise, but it soon became quite a trying time for our world, our country and certainly our community both inside and outside of the church. As I look back over the past year, I am both struck by how much things have changed but also how impressed I am at the way our community has persevered throughout this difficult time. I pray that as things (hopefully!) get back to normal throughout the upcoming year, that we can take what we have learned from this experience and revitalize the ministries that we have been missing for so long.

First of all, thank you for staying connected to your church here at Emmanuel in Fontanelle. I am so glad that we began livestreaming our services back in 2019 so that we were ready for all the changes in 2020. Back then, we were trying to be “forward-looking” but that technology quickly became the “new normal”. You might not have realized it, but other churches in Iowa were looking to us for support for how to do things like Facebook Live, You Tube and Online Giving and it was nice to help them out. Because you supported those changes over a year ago, we were able to help others when they needed assistance. Thank you to everyone who began watching Sunday services on Facebook Live when you were not able to come to church in-person, joined the Online Bible Study or began giving online. Your support has been very much appreciated!

After our church had to close in the middle of March, I led the church service alone for three months. But I wasn't really ever alone. I could never have done it without support. In order to keep the number of people attending low and to slow the spread of Covid-19 in our community, the only people we had at our services at that time were Kellie and Matt Mangels, Clella Buckner and George Feazell. Thanks so much to these members who kept our worship services available! We missed everyone, but at least we could continue with some sense of normalcy. Other ministries continued during this time as well such as multiple funerals, pre-marital counseling over Zoom, weddings and Bible studies as well.

As summer began, our Council made the decision to re-open in July with the necessary precautions to keep everyone safe. I am very grateful to our Council members who took on extra responsibility this last year and found a way to allow our congregation to continue meeting in a safe way. What felt like very conservative measures in the beginning seem to be the standard for churches now. I know that some people in the congregation have felt along the way that we were taking too many risks by being open so soon and singing at services while others have felt that we were being too careful by staying closed as long as we did and continuing to wear masks. I am simply thankful that we can serve all members of our church either online or in-person as well as those outside of our community when they need a place to worship. Throughout this ordeal, our congregation has been able to serve families from outside of our church through baptisms and funerals due to our ability to be open which has been an honor to serve and a blessing to others.

One of the most difficult parts in this last year as a pastor has been trying to figure out how to connect to everyone. First we weren't meeting together at all and then, even after re-opening, the attendance has been much lower. I have tried making many phone calls, but it's just not the same as sitting with you in your living rooms or giving hugs at church or hanging out at ballgames. I miss you all so very much and, even though I am willing to visit with a mask on currently, I know it's just not the same. Please let me know if you or someone you know would like a visit. It has always been something I thought was extremely important and made a priority to do before and I want to get back into the habit as quickly as it is safe to do so. You have all been in my prayers and I can't wait to be able to worship with you all again in person rather than just over a screen.

During prayer time this fall, I felt led by God to revisit our Vision and Mission statements because it somehow felt outdated. “Coming in to be Sent out!” still applies, but how does that look now that so many of us never “come in” to church? How can we be “sent out” when we aren't supposed to go places as often or visit the most vulnerable in their homes? Therefore, I asked the Council to pray and brainstorm some ideas on a

revised Vision and Mission statement in case it needed to be updated. After much discussion and reflection, we felt that we could make the statements a little shorter while better expressing where we feel God is leading our church:

A Vision Statement focuses on WHY our church does what it does. It looks toward the future and is the PURPOSE of our organization. I hope that each of us can memorize this new Vision Statement and contemplate more and more how God might be using these words to call us all into a closer relationship with Him. The new Vision Statement we are presenting is:

“Come To Faith, Honor God’s Word”

This Vision statement helps me to remember that coming to faith in Jesus can happen whether we are “coming in” to worship or worshipping from home during a pandemic. Because we are truly entering in THROUGH faith in Jesus, it’s the FAITH that connects us and brings us together. Furthermore, honoring God’s Word really gets me to thinking about the many ways God calls us in our lives. We are called to honor God’s word as individuals by following the commandments, but we are also called to honor God’s Word by sharing His message far and wide. We honor God’s Word both by listening to the weekly sermon as well as by serving others in our community. What does it mean to you to come to faith? What will it look like for you to honor God’s Word?

A Mission Statement focuses on HOW and WHAT our church does. It looks at what is going on right now and what we are doing on a daily basis. The new Mission Statement we are presenting is the following:

To be inspired and reconnected to God’s Word and God’s People, to share the message of the cross and to bring God’s love and healing to people in need.

Again, I see this Mission Statement as reflecting HOW we accomplish our Vision. We want to come to faith as individuals and to share that faith with others. We do that by reconnecting to the Bible, to church services, and to other Christians. Both the witness of others and the Word of God is important in growing in our faith lives and we want to continue providing opportunities to do those things at Emmanuel. In addition, we want to be focused on sharing God’s love through the message of Jesus’ life, death and resurrection as well as by taking care of the basic needs of those in our community. We want people to experience God’s love by showing them love and compassion in a practical way even if Jesus’ name is never mentioned in our interaction. Because we want others to experience God’s love both in word and in deed. Once people know how much we care, we also want to be free and inspired to share how much God cares for them through Jesus Christ as well.

We hope that these two statements might inspire you to follow God more closely in the year to come and to feel inspired to become involved in the Vision and Mission of Emmanuel Lutheran Church in the future. We have survived 2020! I expect the year 2021 to be an exciting year of reconnection, renewal and spiritual growth both personally and as a church family. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve you and your families throughout the past year and I look forward to walking with you into the future. God bless you! -

I also want to thank those who dropped by to move pews: Rollie Purdy, Brian Fox, John Baudler, Kelly Hall, Bart Bohm, Dave Huff, and Roger Jensen.

We did not receive bids back for the ceiling and chancel because of the shutdown.

In the spring David Sickles, Rollie Purdy, Craig Plymesser, Bill Ernst, Pat Westphal and I spent a couple of days removing trees and fence from the north bank to keep the roots from entering the sewer pipe. Bob Queck provided lunch.

The bank was sprayed twice with Roundup through the summer.

Early September Pat, Rollie, and I seeded the bank with grass. Pat provided a compact tractor and disk he also provided the seed. A few days later Pat, Craig, and I built the fence.

We took bids from Colors Floral and J & A Flouing for carpet on the front steps. Colors has the job at \$1438.45 plus concrete repair. The old carpet was removed because of safety concerns and the new carpet will be installed next spring when the temperature reaches 70 overnight.

Thanks again to all who helped out and my apologies if I missed anyone.

OUTREACH AND ADULT MINISTRY REPORT

Since the pandemic, the Outreach ministry team only met once due to safety concerns.
