

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"All a man's ways seem right to him, but the Lord weighs the heart." Proverbs 21:2

It's been a challenge to be a pastor these last several months. It's hard to know how to lead a congregation when I am unable to interact with most of its members on a consistent basis. It is especially hard to discern the spiritual pulse of our congregation. It used to be that if someone missed church services for three weeks in a row, our church secretary would print out their name on a list. Then I would call on those names and check in on them. Sometimes people were sick or had been to the hospital and I didn't even know it. Sometimes they had been on vacation. At other times, if there was a problem, this phone call gave us a good time to talk about what was going on.

Unfortunately, during this time of trial our world is experiencing, the reasons people have for not coming to church are very different and hard to discern. Not only for me as a pastor, but I believe it is hard even for us as individuals. We might not even understand why we do the things we do without the help of the Holy Spirit. Attending church is still an extremely important part of our life together. There are many good reasons to stay home of course, but ney back to church one day. there are many not so good reasons as well. I would ask you to please ask God to reveal to you the best course of action for you and your family in the weeks and months ahead. Maybe nothing will change, but at least we will be sure that God has led us as a Christian family to make the choices we have decided on.

For example, some people are staying home because they have medical issues or vulnerable household members and do not want to risk being exposed to a dangerous and relatively unknown virus. This is exactly why Facebook Live is such a blessing at this time! You aren't staying home because you are "scared" of the virus anymore than you drive with a seatbelt on because you are "scared" of an accident. You are simply being smart and

responsible. Using the brain and the heart God gave you.

On the other hand, be honest: some of you aren't coming to church but are more than willing to eat out at restaurants, go to sports games, visit family members and go to work with no worries at all! Perhaps you've really just gotten out of the habit of going to church and it's not really about your health after all? Only God can make that clear to you. But if that's the case, I would challenge you to recommit yourself to the discipline of church attendance because it might help you to grow in your faith again.

Some of you are scared. You are living your life right now in fear of not only church crowds but of the world. You may still decide to watch church from home, but God doesn't want you to live the rest of your life in fear either! The Devil loves to use our fears, both real and imagined, to keep us from the abundant life God wants for us. However, only the Holy Spirit will ever be able to change your heart. Before Joshua was to enter the Promised Land, God told him, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened or dismayed. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Perhaps these words might encourage you in your own journey back to church one day.

Others might not be coming to church because they refuse to wear a mask. Masks aren't mandatory for our congregation, but some may think it's wrong that they are encouraged at all! "People of faith shouldn't be afraid of getting sick" so the thinking goes. Maybe you personally don't think this virus is any big deal anyway. Well, a mask is worn to protect others not to protect the person wearing them. And since we as Christians are called to "Love our neighbor as ourselves" Emmanuel will keep encouraging them to be worn. But here's the truth: The Devil can use pride to destroy a Christian community just as much as he can use fear. So if you aren't coming to church because you aren't willing to wear a mask for one hour a week, I would ask yourself who is actu-

The secretary's report was read and corrected. Motion by Raedeen to approve the minutes as corrected. 2nd-ed by Matt G. Carried.

The treasurer's reports were presented by Bill E. and George F. Motion by Roland P. to approve the reports. 2nded by Matt G. Carried.

Pastor Broers presented his monthly mileage/ activities report. Motion by Bill E. to approve. 2nded by Iris W. Carried.

Emergency Benevolence: None.

#### Ministry Reports:

Property—Matt G. reported weeds along the north property line of the church have been sprayed.

Outreach—Very few members have submitted God stories for Pastor to share. Alpha classes—not many have signed up. GROW—there have not been very many register.

Confirmation class started this week in the sanctuary to accommodate social distancing. There will be 13 students. High School bible study—there has been good participation.

#### Old Business:

In-person services—members are adjusting well to the new corvid-19 guidelines. Number of members attending church services are down but many are watching at home on Facebook Live.

Secretary Position—Pastor Broers recommended that the council hire Amy Hoover of Fontanelle for the position of church secretary. Roland P. moved to hire Amy Hoover as church secretary, a part-time

Budget for 2021 was passed at a meeting held this morning in the nave of the church at 9:50 am.

#### **New Business:**

Mission and Vision Statement=--Pastor Broers read the Mission and Vision Statements and encouraged council members to pray and consider whether these need to be updated to be in line with the direction our church is headed. We will devote time and discussion to these statements at future meetings.

Audio/Visual Equipment for live streaming church services—George F., Pastor Broers, and Roland P. met with James Harle from Iowa Audio Video on September 9<sup>th</sup> to consider investing in equipment to enhance our on-line broadcast of church services over FacebookLive. A device called a Pearl mini would allow us to better utilize our soundboard and four cameras for a better quality broadcast. The total cost, including equipment and training of the device and the soundboard, would be approximately \$5,000. Raedeen B. offered to contact our Memorial Committee to see if money might be available for this project.

Motion by Iris W. to purchase a new computer tablet for the church. 2nded by Bill E. Carried.

Motion by Matt G. to adjourn. 2nded by Iris W. Carried. We adjourned at 7:07 pm with the Lord's Prayer.


