FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I hate giving my children baths. I don't like getting wet and they always end up splashing me! It's a miserable experience. I complain about it each and every time, but nothing ever changes. It's been almost two decades now, ever since my oldest was born, and we keep having babies and I keep having to give them baths. And still, I continue to get splashed! Except, every once in a while, the stars align and something amazing happens. I come home and expect to have to give the baths . . . I am already getting anxious, starting to complain and getting my pouty face all ready to go . . . and I am shocked to find out that the baths have already been given! Kristy already did it! She gave the baths! It's done! Hallelujah! And the complaining is unnecessary! And the anxiety is completely guenched! And I am left happy and relieved. All that I can do then is say thank you! Because I am truly grateful. But my gratefulness is never enough because sooner or later, they get dirty again, and I have to give the baths . . . again . . . and NO it does NOT get any better!

But now imagine that we aren't talking about baths at all! Imagine that YOU were the one who was dirty and needed to be washed clean not because of dirt on your body, but because of sin. And you knew that it was going to be a miserable experience trying to find a way to please God after falling into temptation so many times before. You were anxious because you didn't know if you could really and truly love your neighbor as yourself. Deep inside, you thought you were pretty selfish after all and the sin was much more than skin deep. Any loving thoughts, words or deeds were probably only to get you out of trouble so that you might be saved from eternal condemnation apart from God. Imagine you came to the end of your life, terrified and depressed, knowing that there was nothing that you could do that would ever be enough to wash yourself clean.

Then you are shocked to find out that you have already been washed clean and your sin is gone! Jesus Christ already did it! He washed you clean in the blood of His sacrifice on the cross. There is nothing left to be done! Hallelujah! And your fear is completely unnecessary! And your anxiety is totally quenched! And you are left happy and relieved. And all that you can really do is say thank you! Because you are eternally grateful. And, unlike an Earthly bath, Jesus only has to wash you once. You never have to be washed again! You simply confess your sins to God and Jesus reminds you that He washed those away on the cross just like all the others. Can you imagine an experience like that!

I hope that you can because that is EXACTLY what happened when Jesus died on the cross for you. It is finished. When you put your faith in Him, the work of your cleansing and salvation was accomplished. Once and for all and most importantly for you! That's what the Easter celebration is all about. We are free from having to try and wash ourselves to look good to God. Jesus already did all of that work for us. Now we have the opportunity to thank Him.

We can thank Him by telling others the good news so that they might be washed clean just as we have been. We can thank Him by loving others so that they might know how much God loves them as well. And we can worship God with all of our hearts as we join together and sing His praises with others who have been washed clean as well. What a gift Jesus has given us! To do something for us that we could never have done ourselves! We are free to live our lives with peace and joy because our sins are forgiven and we are now whiter than snow. Thank you God for your forgiveness! Thank you God for washing us clean from our sins! Thank you God for doing all the work for us! Thank you God for Jesus! Amen.

President George Feazell called the regular meeting to order at 5:30 pm in the parish hall. Those present were George F., Matt Gross, Raedeen Bigelow, Lynn Christensen, Iris Westphal, Bill Ernst, Dan Dreher, Nellie Griffith, Pastor Steven Broers, and Roland Purdy. Also present were incoming council members Samantha Gettler and Craig Plymesser.

Devotions were read by Pastor Broers.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read by Roland Purdy. Motion by Raedeen B. to approve the minutes. 2nded by Iris Westphal. Carried.

Treasurer's Reports were given by Bill E. and George F. Motion by Dan D. to approve the reports. 2nded by Matt G. Carried.

Pastor Broers presented his monthly mileage/ activities report. Motion by Bill E. to approve. 2nded by Roland P. Carried.

Emergency Benevolence: None.

Ministry Reports:

Altar Guild—will meet next Sunday, February 28th.

- Property—Pastor Broers reported there is water finding its way into the inside walls of the parsonage, probably due to water damming on the roof caused by snow melting and refreezing. The Property Committee will address the problem.
- Music & Worship—For Lenten Services words to all the hymns will not be printed in the bulletins. People will be encouraged to use the handouts.

Children's Ministry—

- GROW—First Communion Training will begin February 21st for those in 5th grade and meet either in person or online. First Communion will be on Palm Sunday, March 28th.
- High School—Bible Study has been meeting earlier on Wednesdays which has increased attendance.
- Memorial Committee—there is a good amount of money available for memorial projects.
- Outreach—Money was raised for gift cards for all healthcare workers at Adair County Memorial Hospital in Greenfield. Pastor Broers delivered the cards this last week. Each card is worth \$10 in Green Bucks to be used at businesses in Greenfield. The cards were given as a thank you for the healthcare workers' extra time and safety measures, due to the Covid-19 virus. The cards were very much appreciated.
- In light of the virus threat and related safety measures, the Council decided to postpone plans for a Seder Meal (a Passover meal) until next year.

Old Business:

- Amy, our church secretary, sent word thanking the Council for her Christmas bonus. She looks forward to getting to know more people in the coming year.
- Only two new members were elected to the Council at the Annual Meeting in January 2021. The Council can stay at eight elected members, or can appoint a ninth member, to be approved at the next con-

gregational meeting.

- George F. will put a note in the next newsletter addressing the higher cost of the pastor's cellphone and Verizon plan.
- Livestreaming Equipment—Dan D. moved to approve signing a contract with Iowa Audio/Video for installation and training on new equipment to improve the livestreaming of our services over Facebook-Live and Youtube; and another contract (also with IAV) for training on our soundboard. Total cost of the two contracts is \$4,847.59 and \$866.70 respectively. 2nded by Iris W. Carried. Money for both contracts is to come from the Memorial Committee, and has been approved by that committee.

Members of the Council thanked the three outgoing members (Lynn Christensen, George Feazell, and Roland Purdy) for their service.

Motion by Roland P. to adjourn. 2nded by Iris W. Carried. We adjourned at 6:32 pm. The Reorganizational Meeting was to follow.
