## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

According to the Merriam-Webster dictionary, the term "cancel culture" is the practice of engaging in the cancelling (withdrawal of support of a person) as a way of expressing disapproval and exerting social pressure. Cancelling is about more than just criticizing a person's views or opinions. It's about ostracizing them, seeking to destroy a person, for their views or opinions. The goal of cancel culture is often to take away a person's position, job or means of making a living because of their stance on some political or cultural topic. Some argue that cancel culture helps the public to hold famous people accountable for their behavior and allow them to learn from their mistakes. But what often happens is that there isn't any opportunity for a change of heart but, instead, just a demand for someone to lose their job or be publicly shamed.

Jesus never seemed to shy away from holding people accountable. Yet, I don't think he would have been a big fan of cancel culture for many reasons. I want to share with you some ways that the Bible would have us cancel the cancel culture.

First, the Bible teaches us that we are all sinners. Romans 3:20 says, "Therefore, no one will be declared righteous in God's sight by observing the law; rather, through the law, we become conscious of sin." God tells us that we are all in the same predicament. We ALL deserve to be cancelled! But, rather than being worried about what other people think of us, He wants us to be more interested in what God thinks about what we say and think and do.

Second, the Bible teaches us that we shouldn't judge other people as being worse than we are. "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged." (Matthew 7:1) This reminds me of the episode a few years ago

when Carson King, a former ISU student, was publicly shamed by a journalist for some inappropriate posts he had put on social media and then, later, that journalist lost their job for their own inappropriate posts. My internship supervisor would tell me that when you point the finger, there are three other fingers pointing back at you! The Bible tells us to be very wary of hypocrisy, "First take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye."

Third, the Bible teaches us that the goal of accountability is to lead to repentance and forgiveness. "Do I take any pleasure in the death of the wicked? Declares the Sovereign Lord. Rather, am I not pleased when they turn from their ways and live?" (Ezekiel 18:23) Romans 12:21 says, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." The problem with cancel culture is that it can certainly point out a person's failings, but there is no conversation available to help them make amends. Being publicly ostracized leads to embarrassment but not necessarily to a respect of another person's viewpoints. If you force a person to lose their job because they believe differently than you do, do you think that person is going to want to change their mind to make you happy? Probably not!

God knows that every day we are going to come into contact with a lot of people who think, act and believe differently than we do. Instead of shaming them, try to understand them, pray for them and maybe even try to talk with them. Your kindness and compassion will do much more to change someone's mind than trying to destroy their reputation. Because remember, even when you mess up, Jesus is always there is forgive you and help you repent and live a new way. Amen.

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm by President Matt Gross

Present were Matt Gross, Raedeen Bigelow, Craig Plymesser, Bill Ernst, Iris Westphal, Nellie Griffith, Samantha Gettler, and Dan Berg. Excused absence: Dan Dreher. Guest: George Feazell.

Pastor Steve B. opened the meeting with a devotion around Psalm 119 and a prayer.

The minutes of the August 8 council meeting were read. Motion to approve by Bill E., seconded by Samantha G. and carried.

The treasurer's report was given by Bill E. Bill reviewed income and expenses and noted that the that \$2,000.00 had been donated to sponsor sheep in the Grow Program. Discussion followed. Bill reminded us that we need to ask contractors for proof of insurance. Motion to approve the treasurer's report by Iris W., seconded by Raedeen B., and approved.

Pastor's report: Nellie G. motioned to approve, seconded by Bill E, and carried.

Pastor Steve reported there were no requests for emergency benevolence. There was discussion on our benevolence donations for next quarter, due in October.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Women of the ELCA: No report

**Alter Guild:** Work will begin on collecting food for the food pantry this fall.

**Property:** Dan reported that new programmable Wi-Fi capable thermostats had been ordered.

He also reported that Rollie is investigate costs for upgrading the speakers and projection system. Ideas are still in very early stages. George showed us possible locations using some cardboard props. Research will continue.

There was discussion on the replacement of the carpet for the front steps not meeting the contract agreements. The council agreed that Dan should pursue fulfilling the requirements of the contract.

It was noted that the batteries in the fire alarms are due for replacement this month.

Dan D. will schedule a time to finish removal of the trees in the east property line fence.

#### Children's Ministry:

#### **GROW**

- -The "Sponsor-A-Sheep" campaign has already raised enough money to sponsor 41 sheep!
- -The G.R.O.W. Volunteers have been called and we held our training Aug. 28<sup>th</sup>. Many were able to come. We are still in need of 1-2 teachers and 1-2 helpers.

-G.R.O.W. Registration forms were taken to the Elementary and Middle Schools to be sent home.

-Sunday, September 5<sup>th</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders received their Bibles.

-Wednesday, September 1<sup>st</sup> – G.R.O.W. started. We've had a total of 35 kids during the 2 weeks with an average of 25.5. We have been thankful for the required masks as we have already had both volunteers and kids out either as close contacts to COVID or with COVID. We have quite a few new faces this year and some new volunteers. We are also mailing lesson packets home to those that have requested them. We have changed the way we serve food this year so that the kitchen volunteers serve each youth in PreK-4<sup>th</sup> upstairs and the teachers/helpers serve downstairs in 5/6 and it's working really well! This year's theme is Love.

#### -Confirmation

-Pastor Broers held 2 Confirmation meetings as well as 5 individual confirmation meetings to meet with the students and parents for this upcoming year. There are still a few parents that were unable to meet.

-Confirmation began Wednesday, Sept.  $1^{st}$ . There are 15 confirmation students this year  $-8 \cdot 7^{th}$  graders &  $7 \cdot 8^{th}$  graders.

-Sunday, Sept.  $5^{\rm th}$  – was the Confirmation Service of Promise.

-Pastor Broers is still in need of a second adult at Confirmation. He has reached out to many people, but has been unable to find anyone.

#### -High School

-The weekly High School Bible Studies began Wednesday, Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>, with a campfire in the parsonage yard. There were 5 youth present. High School Bible Study will meet most weeks in the confirmation room at the church. Kathy Thompson has agreed to be the second adult at high school Bible study.

#### -Children's Ministry

-Children's Ministry met Sunday, August 8<sup>th</sup>, at 4:30 PM, with 7 people present.

-Kristy learned this week that the person at the Fontanelle Methodist Church that helped organize VBS no longer attends the church, so she is hoping someone else is able to help with things on that end.

Matt noted that the accordion doors between the sanctuary and the parish hall needed to be replaced, and that there is a problem with the toilet in the women's bathroom in the basement. Both will be further researched.

Pastor handed out a copy of an evaluation form for the secretary's position and asked the council to review and edit as needed.

Pastor asked for approval for expenses of driving to the LCMC Annual Event in Columbus, OH. rather than flying. Council agreed.

Iris W. moved at 7:38 pm to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Dan Berg. Motion approved.

Have you ever hosted Thanksgiving dinner? What was involved in getting the food ready? You had to decide what you were serving and maybe even considered possible food allergies for the people who were attending. Then, you wrote down the list of all the ingredients you needed and what you had to buy at the grocery store. Then, you have to schedule when to start thawing the turkey and when you would have to place it in the oven to make sure that the corn casserole, the mashed potatoes and the turkey come out around the same time. And you probably already planned to make the pumpkin pie a day in advance so that dessert would be ready . . . and don't forget to thaw the Cool Whip to put on top! There is a lot of preparation involved to make such a big meal a success! But, even more importantly, it doesn't matter how good the food is at Thanksgiving if everyone is upset and fighting the whole time around the table. A perfectly wonderful meal will be ruined if the hearts of those eating it are not in the right place.

As I was preparing this month's newsletter article, my wife, Kristy, encouraged me to read a from her Experi-



encing God daily devotional. It discussed how our worship of God can be affected a great deal by how we prepare for worship . . . not just about whether we show up or not. If you stay up really late on a Saturday night and are half asleep throughout all of a Sunday service, it doesn't matter whether the sermon was insightful and inspiring or not. You probably won't hear most of it. If you are nursing a grudge against one of the musicians on the Praise Team, don't be surprised if the music seems less than wonderful that week.

A lot of times, we treat church as if we are the consumers of a product meant to please us and inspire us when, in fact, worship is not about us at all! It's about taking time to reconnect to God and the other Christians around us. The Devotional said, "Attending a religious service will not automatically ensure an encounter with God. If you are not satisfied with the quality of your worship, don't be too quick to blame your environment. Look first to your own heart. Allow God to refine your heart until it is pleasing to Him, and you will be free to worship God as He intends."


