FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Come to Faith. Honor God's Word." That is the Vision of our church and I think the beginning of the year is a good time to consider what that means for us as a community. First, I would encourage you to think about what it means to you? Does it inspire you to think differently about what we are doing as a church? Does it motivate you to do something different in your own life? If you were to add to our Vision, what would you add? How would YOU say it so that it meant something specifically for you?

A Vision statement is meant to give us an overall understanding of why we do what we do. What our purpose is in the world and in our community. To begin, I think it might be helpful to remember what our last Vision was and why it was changed.

Previously, our Vision was this: "Coming in to be sent out!" I really LOVED that Vision! It was inspiring to me personally to remember that the whole reason we come to church is to make a difference in our community! But then something happened . . . the pandemic. And suddenly, every time I remembered our Vision it seemed to be lacking something very important and God encouraged me to bring it up to our Council. This statement only made sense as long as people were coming IN to a location like church. How could we fulfill our call when the place we worshipped was closed for three months? How could we fulfill our purpose when so many were now watching services online? Was our purpose really about a PLACE at all or was it about much more than that?

"Come to Faith" gets to the point that the last Vision was trying to make. It's NOT about coming IN to a particular location. We can worship God at home or at a church building, by coming to a PERSON – JESUS!

"Come to me all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28) "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:7) "I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out and find pasture." (John 10:9) Notice that the scripture verse referring to "Coming in" was actually meaning "Come to Jesus". And coming to Jesus was about putting our faith in Him and His power to heal, redeem and save! Jesus is EVERYWHERE and He wants us to come to faith in Him so that we can be sent out to make a difference in the world. So our new Vision encompasses what our last Vision was trying to say but making it applicable to our new world and many more situations.

"Honor God's Word" is very similar. We are still being called to be "Sent out!" but why and for what purpose? We are called to honor God's Word in our personal lives by following God's Laws as well as repenting when we fall short of God's expectations. We are also called to honor God's Word by serving others through love and sacrifice. Finally, we are called to honor God's Word by sharing the good news of Jesus' birth, life and resurrection. We can do that be "going" somewhere, but we can also do it by staying right where we are either in a church service, on the internet or at a local coffee shop. We can honor God's Word by traveling to other countries and serve as Missionaries but we can also honor God's Word by sitting and listening to our spouse share their deepest concerns and desires. However, nothing we go out and do honors God until we have come to faith in Jesus Christ.

Once we have "Come to Faith" then we can "Honor God's Word". "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me


