### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In the gospel of John, a man named Nathanael doubted whether Jesus could possibly be the Messiah. His friend Philip told him, "Come and see!" Notice how Philip didn't spend his time explaining or arguing with Nathanael. He trusted that if Nathanael experienced Jesus himself. Nathanael would be convinced by Jesus.

In the past, I have always considered the concept of asking people to "Come and see" to be a great evangelistic tool. You don't have to argue or convince someone to believe in Jesus. Just bring them to church so that they can meet the people within the community and experience the music and hear the message! God should be able to create faith in someone's heart all on His own.

But I have noticed a problem with this idea of "Come and see" . . . fewer and fewer people, even longtime committed members of our church, attend worship regularly. I don't think that this means that people have stopped believing in Jesus, but Sunday worship doesn't seem to be where they desire to hear about Him. Of course, people still attend, but not near- age number of hours spent ly as often.

And if people are not "coming in" to the church building, how are we to "send them back out" with God's message? How are we to teach our children about God's love and help them to learn God's laws? If online almost constantly.' someone isn't coming to church very often, they probably won't be bringing friends with them either. So how are we to make disciples and be a part of God's growing kingdom?

A bank robber named Willie Sutton was once asked why he robbed banks. Sutton supposedly answered, "Because that's where the money is." In medicine, Sutton's Law states that when diagnosing a problem, you should start with the obvious answers. If people aren't as likely to attend church as often, perhaps we should find out where they are going and encourage people to "come and see" Jesus there!

According to the website "Our World In Data", in the year 2019, 1/3 of all people in the world use social media platforms such mon as a podcast that can as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram including 2/3 of all people using the internet. That's a lot of people (3.5 billion to be exact). In 2018, the aver on digital media was 6

hours a day. More specifically, "according to the Pew Research Center, adults 18 -29 are more likely to get news directly from social media than newspapers or news sites and report being

I have heard stories about Fontanelle in the 1950's where the square was packed every Saturday night and church was full every Sunday morning. That was the time each week when people interacted with one another, learned about what was aoina on in the community and shared their opinions.
