FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Death has been swallowed up in victory. 'Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." 1 Corinthians 54b-47

As I am writing this, we have spent one week apart from one another as a community. Last Sunday was the first Sunday where we didn't gather together in order to stop the spread of the Covid-19 virus. While I certainly missed seeing everyone, I am glad that we are doing everything that we can in order to protect one another and stay safe. Looking ahead, there are still a lot of things left unknown. We aren't sure whether we will have Easter Sunday worship together or not on April 12th. I am assuming that we probably won't. We don't know whether school or church will even get to meet again for a couple of months! With all of this uncertainty, life can feel quite scary and unnerving.

But the message of Easter is made especially for this time of our lives. The message of Easter is that Jesus died and was raised from the dead! This gives each one of us the same hope. That even though we die, whenever and however that happens, God has promised that He will raise us to live with Him. I can't think of very many things more uncertain or unknown than death after all. Nothing more scary to most people than what's going to happen when they die. How and when it will happen are all mysteries. And yet, with faith in Christ Jesus, we can trust that no matter WHAT happens, we have nothing to worry about because God has promised that we have already won the victory over death!

That can give us a blessed assurance even now as we go through the days, weeks and months of uncertainty around this virus. Jesus has already won the victory over death!

That's good news whether you are quarantined at home, still working in a store or even recovering in a hospital somewhere. No matter what happens, God is on your side and the battle has already been won. Even the most unknown of all things, death itself, the greatest enemy of humankind, has been defeated by Jesus on His cross. "Death has been swallowed up in victory" the Bible says. That doesn't mean we still might not feel scared of it or feel unnerved by our circumstances on a given day, but we can know that on the other side of it all, no matter what, Jesus has won the battle and gives us the victory along with Him!

On a daily basis this message might not make all things better. You might still get very stressed out by having your kids at home or, maybe even more likely, being by yourself all of the time and having NO ONE home. But the message of Easter gives us HOPE! And HOPE is what you need to make it through the day and to wake up the next morning with the expectation of a new day! God never promised that life would be easy for us, but He did promise that no matter how hard it was, He would struggle through it all with us and that, believe it or not. He would help us succeed in the end. He would give us the victory over sin, death and the Devil! No matter whether you feel like you are losing your mind right now or winning parent-ofthe-year awards, God has already won and when your time on Earth is done, He will share His victory with you.

When this time of fear and uncertainty is over, I pray that everyone in our community and our country feels like we have joined together and won a major victory. The good news of Easter is that when our life is over, Jesus will share in His victory with us and that peace and joy will last forever. Happy Easter!

We are homeschooling our kids, we are not attending any of our normal spring events, we are attending worship at home on Facebook live, and we find ourselves wondering when life will get back to normal. I don't know about you, but in my house there have been times of fear that we've shared with each other. There have also been times of great hope and blessing.

We have made a tough decision here at Emmanuel to end the G.R.O.W. year now. With school planning to resume on April 13th, we find ourselves with only 3 weeks of normal G.R.O.W. remaining as well as the Fun Run. With more and more schools closing for the remainder of the year, we decided this would be the best decision to make at this time. We are very sad that we will not gather together again with this group of kids or celebrate the awesome year we have had, but we want to keep everyone safe.

Going forward I will continue to put the G.R.O.W. lessons on our G.R.O.W. Facebook page each week so that you can share the lesson as a family at home. You are the very best faith teachers your child can have. You do not need to have all the answers – none of us do! 

We have been in awe as we have watched our children step up and lead us. Often we choose 1-2 verses in the Bible and then the child asks 1-3 questions about the verses chosen that we discuss. To wrap up the devotional, they lead us in a short prayer. So far many of the verses have been about fear and trust. It has given us an opportunity to start our day off as a family focused on God. It has given us a chance to share our feelings vulnerably. It has also given us a chance to see our children mature in their faith. It has been a gift, really. If you are parents of a young child, start the day off by reading a story in a children's Bible or read the Bible and pray together. Starting off your day with God is such an important thing.
