FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

""But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law." — Galatians 5:22-23

You might have noticed recently that the longer you have been stuck at home. the more upset you have become. More angry. More short-tempered. I have read some articles about this being a symptom of depression which is certainly possible and important to look into if you feel that is what you are going through. But I also think it might be connected to simple fatigue at the situations and events of the last six months. You can only take the stress of life and uncertainty for so long until you snap! This reminded me of what the Bible says about being "patient" and how it's easy to forget what it really means and how to accomplish this important behavior.

The word patience sounds great but is difficult to do in practice. As the old saying goes, "Please, God, grant me patience and GIVE IT TO ME NOW!!!" But the word written in Greek in our Bibles used to be translated differently. Instead of using the word "patience" it was translated "longsuffering". To be honest, I think that the old translation was better. It describes what "patience" actually feels like and helps explain how to

actually get better at this behavior as well.

Being patient often means dealing with situations, people or events that you do not like. You experience suffering of some type and you want that suffering to end. The fruit of the spirit is about being able to live with that suffering without trying to force it to stop in some way. Trusting that God is in control even when you are not. Believing that things will work out for the good even when you feel upset. Hoping for the best even when things look their worst. People that are impatient lash out at others who make them unhappy. Someone who is longsuffering allows the uncomfortable feelings to pass instead of trying to force them to stop.

Many of us are tired of all the stress and uncertainty in our world today. We want things to go back to normal even if we recognize that they probably won't. At least not anytime soon. We try to be patient, but it's hard to know how exactly to accomplish that. The word "longsuffering" gives us a way forward. It seems to imply that when we are suffering from fear we can live with that. We can cope through prayer, reaching out for help and finding other useful resources to calm ourselves down. We don't have to "escape" the fear. It's part of life. Patient people aren't "happy" during suffering

necessarily. They just accept that difficulties are a part of life and find a way to suffer through it without making things worse through anger.

The truth is that wishing or even praying doesn't always take suffering away. It is wrong for us to believe that Christians always get whatever they pray for or that God will make life easy if only we were faithful. We can be certain that God loves us even when we experience pain in life and no matter how long we experience that pain as well. Jesus, God's only Son, died on the cross even though He was loved by His Father above all! Can we expect anything different? And yet, because Jesus suffered with restraint, His witness helped others to come to faith. It is our patience, or longsuffering, that can also be a witness to others about the power of the Holy Spirit to strengthen us even during difficult times.

I know that this time in our lives is hard. It's easy to become angry. But God calls us to a life of patience, perseverance and longsuffering. And He promises to help us every step of the way. Amen.

Music & Worship—organists for the Traditional Service will go back to a regular schedule.

Outreach—the Monday morning virtual bible studies are going well with lots of participation. The number of people following the YouTube devotions has dropped off. Pastor Broers plans to make it a point to remind members of the devotions during Sunday morning services.

Children's Ministry—there was a lot of discussion about having in-person GROW activities vs online. Kristy Broers' original plan was to follow regular school's guidelines regarding the coronavirus. Those guidelines were supposed to be released by July 1, but have not been released yet. Kristy is not comfortable leading GROW in person, but would certainly help with preparations beforehand. She will contact GROW volunteers to see if they are willing to come for in-person activities. The council will talk more about it at our August meeting.

Old Business:

The council feels like we are doing the right thing-offering the guidelines of social distancing and wearing masks while attending church. We will continue to stream both services on Facebook Live.

Motion by Iris W. to adjourn. 2nded by Matt G. Carried. We adjourned at 7:15 PM with the Lord's Prayer.




