But as I think about Christmas and the gifts involved, I remembered this passage from Louisa May Alcott's classic book *Little Women*:

"It's so dreadful to be poor!" sighed Meg, looking down at her old dress.

"I don't think it's fair for some girls to have plenty of pretty things, and other girls nothing at all," added little Amy, with an injured sniff.

"We've got Father and Mother, and each other," said Beth contentedly from her corner.

From these short quotes, you can already guess a little bit about each of these characters that will be expanded as the story goes along. How we understand the presents and gifts we give and receive can also tell us a little bit about ourselves as well.

And the price never increases! It's as free today as it was 2000 years ago. And we have a church that is strong and vital and filled with all kinds of gifts. E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—10/12/2021

The meeting was called to order at 5:34 pm by President Matt Gross

Present were Matt Gross, Raedeen Bigelow, Craig Plymesser, Iris Westphal, Nellie Griffith, Samantha Gettler, and Dan Berg. Excused late arrivals; Dan Dreher and Pastor Broers. Excused absence: Bill Ernst. Guest: George Feazell, Brenda Plymesser.

Craig and Brenda Plymesser gave an overview of the LCMC Gathering in Hilliard, Ohio. There was 445 delegates present. The budget for 2022 of \$1,311,125.00 was approved. (same as 2021 budget.) Five directors were replaced or re-elected to serve on the board of trustees. There are currently 799 member congregations in the U.S. and 186 international congregations for a total of 985 members with 60 pending memberships yet this year. Average yearly congregational support of LCMC is \$2,143.00 ranging from \$12.00 and up. There were no amendments to the constitution or by-laws. Featured speakers were LCMC staff or LCMC pastors from around the membership. There were 29 breakout sessions. Brenda and I attended "Constructive Conversation in a Time of Social and Racial Unrest, LCMC Men's Group, Servant Evangelism in the Community, Praying with Jesus, and Discipleship; The Engine that drives the Church. We both found the gathering to be inspirational and full of great information, and would be happy to discuss our findings with all.

The minutes of the September 12 council meeting were read. Motion to approve by Iris W., seconded by Dan B. and carried.

The treasurer's report was given by George Feazell. George reviewed income and expenses and noted that the that the Sponsor A Sheep in the Grow Program is fully funded. Discussion followed. He also noted that we have restored our cash reserve to \$40,000.00 Motion to approve the treasurer's report by Craig P., seconded by Raedeen B., and approved.

Pastor Broers arrived gave us a devotions on Isaiah 40.

Pastor's report: Pastor Steve reported there were \$400.00 requested for emergency benevolence. Raedeen B. motioned to approve, seconded by Iris W, and carried.

Raedeen B. led a discussion on our benevolence donations of \$7,846.00 for next quarter, due in October. Nellie G. motioned, seconded by Dan B. to approve, and carried.

Committee Reports:

Women of the ELCA: No report

Alter Guild: There are plans to erect the Christmas tree for the 1st Sunday in Advent. There are plans to decorate the church for Thanksgiving on November 7.

Property: Dan reported that the trees in the property line east of the church have been removed. Special thanks to Matt Gross, Dan Berg and Dan Dreher for assistance.

WiFi extenders were installed for the new programmable Wi-Fi capable thermostats.

The contract to finish the work in the sanctuary was reviewed and approved.

Work on the parsonage property line trees and fence have been delayed until later this fall.

A new toilet will be installed for the women's bathroom in the basement, but not sure that will fix due to possibly collapsed sewer lines.

There was discussion on how to repair/replace the accordion doors between the Parish Hall and the Sanctuary. Matt and Dan will work on getting estimates.

Music and Worship: No report

- -We have begun discussing Operation Christmas Child, which will take place on Nov. 10th.
- -The offering goal the 3rd & 4th graders chose was to purchase a sheep, a llama, and bees through Heifer International. The total for their goal is \$300.
- -The GROW shirts have now been ordered. The price is higher this year as we got tiedye shirts to celebrate last year being the 10th year of G.R.O.W. (we didn't have shirts last year) and because we put the year's theme verse on the back.

-Confirmation

- -The Confirmation students have an upcoming fundraising breakfast on October 24th. The money is being raised to help the students attend Okoboji Lutheran Bible camp this November.
- -Heidi Sorensen has now joined Louise Johnson as a volunteer for confirmation each week.
