FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

May 2022

"If anyone says, 'I love God' yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen." Those are powerful words. And difficult to live out. But living out this scripture passage is an important step to spiritual maturity.

When you grow up in the church, you think of yourself as a Christian because that's what your parents are and, therefore, that's what you are as well. You identify as a believer and we know that salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ alone. But sometimes we forget about what believing in Jesus actually MEANS. What it actually looks like in daily life. It's very easy to identify as a Christian and yet live out the values of the society around us as well. Sometimes because we just don't realize what the Bible says and sometimes because God's Word is so counter-cultural to what everyone else encourages us to do.

For example, if someone hurts you in some way, how should you respond? The world will give you lots of ideas. "Don't get mad . . . get even." Or here's another one: "Fool me once, shame on you. Fool me twice, shame on me." The Bible gives us a very different perspective. When Jesus was asked by a disciple about how many times they should forgive a brother who had sinned against them, Jesus responded by saying not seven times, but seventy-times seven times. The point was not about counting how often you forgive, but that forgiveness is indefinite. Jesus says to love our enemies, not just our friends. The scripture reading that started this article explains that while "hate" is normal in society, it is completely unacceptable in the life of a Christian. That doesn't mean that we won't feel this natural emotion, but that we are to turn away from letting that hatred infect our lives every chance we get. Choosing to love people, even those who are sometimes difficult to love, is part of what it means to identify as a Christian.

How can we love someone who is un-

kind to us? Why should we love them instead of hurting them back? "We love because God first loved us." Jesus died on the cross for us because we betrayed Him. Jesus died on the cross for us because we are sinners. He doesn't love us because we are loveable. He loves us because we are NOT loveable. It would be easy for God to hate us because He hates sin and we sin every day. But because Jesus died for us, He chooses to forgive us and love us instead. This serves not only as an example for us to follow but also inspires us to see how loving others can change us and the world around us.

In school, I remember reading about the Hatfields and the McCoys. These were two families that had been feuding for generations. I remember thinking, all it would take is for one of the next generations to just decide enough is enough! To stop getting each other back every time they are hurt. In order to fight, you need to have two parties willing to argue. When one side just gives up and forgives, the fight is over. If you are currently in a relationship gone bad, imagine if you just decided to forgive? Perhaps all the bitterness, anger and sadness might begin to leave.

A great scripture reading about this very idea comes from the book of 1st Corinthians chapter 6: "The very fact that you have lawsuits among you means you have been completely defeated already. Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be cheated?" Can you see how very counter-cultural those words seem to the advice most people would give you? When we are cheated, we want to get paid back! When we are wronged, we want the other person to feel the pain we felt! But God tells us to live a different way: a way of forgiveness, love and joy even in the face of trials and suffering. We have all tried to live the way the world wants us to live, why not try living God's way instead? A way of love, not hate. Amen.

The regular council meeting was called to order at 5:02 pm by President Gross.

Present: Matt Gross, Craig Plymesser, Bill Ernst, Dan Dreher, Samantha Gettler, David Huff, Louise Johnson, Gini Herr, Dan Berg, and Pastor Steve Broers.

Guests: George Feazell

Pastor opened the meeting with devotions from Romans 12 about trusting and patience.

Secretary Craig Plymesser read the minutes of the February 13 council meeting and the February 13 reorganization meeting. Motion to approve as corrected by Samantha Gettler, 2nd by Dan Berg, and approved.

Treasurer Gini Herr presented the financial report, noting that all items were at or under budget for the month of February. There was some discussion on the printing costs.

Motion to approve the financial report by Samantha Gettler, 2nd by Bill Ernst, and carried.

Pastor presented his expenses and report, noting that there was no emergency benevolence requested. He also noted that he had been busy with funerals and phone call visits.

Motion to approve Pastor's expenses, and an emergency benevolence requests for \$500.00 by Gini Herr, 2nd by David Huff and approved. Bill Ernst and Louise Johnson will serve on the emergency benevolence committee.

Property: Plaster work in the sanctuary should be completed this week. Special thanks to those who helped move all the furniture from the altar area.

Work needed in the parsonage was reviewed, including counter tops, cabinets, ventilation on the bathrooms, replacement of sewer/drain system in the basement. Dan Dreher will obtain bids for the basement work. Cabinet/countertop bids will be obtained this fall.

Removing trees/shrubs from the parsonage property and replacing with a fence were discussed. It was agreed that a start date should be before April 10 th meeting or begin search for a new contractor.

A/V plans for the sanctuary were discussed with no conclusions.

Significant progress is being made on replacing the accordion doors between the sanctuary and the Parish hall.

Music and Worship: Palm Sunday will be a blended service starting at 9:30 am.

Children's Ministry: GROW




