

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It's wonderful to look out the car windows as I am driving and see the corn growing during the hot and humid days of summer. All those seeds planted in the Spring are getting a little bigger every day. Summertime is also a great time to watch our youth grow in their relationship to Jesus. All the seeds planted throughout the school year at church and GROW are maturing a little more every day! We can't see all the changes happening from day to day; we simply trust that God is working and we look forward to the future harvest.

This week we are seeing a ton of growth at Vacation Bible School. Riverside Bible camp sent four counselors who have been leading these youth to learn Bible verses each day, teaching them songs about Jesus, doing crafts and just having an all-around good time. Sometimes parents have asked me about what running around playing games has to do with learning about Jesus? While the games may not clearly be teaching a Bible story, what they do is open the kids up to learning about Jesus at other times throughout the week. If we can get them smiling and laughing during a game or a song, they let down their guard in order to hear the words of Jesus that can change their life! And when they have great experiences at church and connect having fun to learning about God, it helps them feel more comfortable learning about faith in the future.

Many of our youth will also be attending Ingham-Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp this summer either for Confirmation camp or Senior High camp. At camp, they will spend a week doing all kinds of activities as well as being a part of multiple worship services where they will focus on the theme "Anchored in Christ". These camps can be life-changing experiences for those who attend. In fact, an informal survey several years ago indicated that 75% of pastors have been involved with outdoor ministry as a child. If you asked them what they did at camp, they would probably tell you about

the cute girls they met, or about rowing a canoe, or about a friend who burped milk out of his nose; however, what actually happened in their faith life was impactful enough to lead them closer to Jesus. As the book of Romans puts it, "In all things, God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose." (Romans 8:28)

One of the greatest blessings about being here at Emmanuel is the commitment that you all have to support the youth of our community. You sponsor-a-sheep for the GROW program and many of you volunteer on Wednesday nights, you pray for our confirmation students and our church pays for half of the registration fees for any child from anywhere to attend a Bible camp of their choosing. In addition, we are praying for the possibility of receiving a Youth Minister in Training from Riverside to come this Fall and help us grow even more in our youth ministry. God is already doing great things in our community to help our youth grow in their faith and we are hoping to make an even bigger impact in the future.

Please remember that you're never too old to grow in your faith. While we emphasize youth ministry a lot over the summer, it is a great time to focus your attention on getting closer to God as an adult as well. We are all children of God and while you might not be going to camp this summer, it's still a great time to learn about Jesus on your own. Doing a daily devotion helps many people stay connected to the Bible, volunteering to help with worship might encourage you to attend regularly even over the hectic summer months, and taking ten minutes to pray can remind you to focus less on the little things that cause anxiety and more on God who promises to take care of you. We can't see how God is changing us from day to day, but the seeds that were planted in us as children are still growing and as we mature as Christians we can glorify God more and more until Jesus comes again. Amen.

E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES-05/08/2022

The regular council meeting was called to order at 5:00 pm by President Gross.

Present: Matt Gross, Craig Plymesser, Bill Ernst, Dan Dreher, Samantha Gettler, David Huff, Louise Johnson, Gini Herr, Dan Berg, and Pastor Steve Broers.

Guests: George Feazell, Paul Bigelow

Pastor opened the meeting with devotions from James, Chapter 1.

Secretary Craig Plymesser read the minutes of the April 10 council meeting. Motion to approve by Gini Herr, 2nd by Bill Ernst, and approved.

Treasurer Gini Herr presented the financial report, noting that all items were at or under budget.

Motion to approve the financial report by Dan Dreher, 2nd by Dan Berg, and carried.

Pastor presented his expenses and report. Motion to approve Pastor's expenses, and an emergency benevolence requests for \$425.00 by David Huff, 2nd by Bill Ernst, and approved.

Altar Guild: Pastor reported that the Altar Guild had recently met, and their minutes will be in the newsletter.

Property: We have not yet received estimates for work on replacing sewer pipes in the parsonage or the basement bathrooms. We have yet to receive new estimates for the removal of the shrubs/trees and installing a new fence for the parsonage. Dan will keep pursuing contractors to get their estimates in.

He is also working to get an estimate for removal of the dead ash tree by the driveway of the parsonage.

Music and Worship: N/R

Children's Ministry:

- Grow is over for the year. The fun run was well attended.
- Confirmation 7th grade is done for the year, 8th grade will meet through the end of May to finish up their requirements and do their faith statements.
- High school Bible study will meet through the end of May.
- No Confirmation or high school Bible study this week due to baccalaureate.

Memorial: Paul Bigelow presented a treasurer's report for the memorial committee. There is a total of \$40,957.05 in the account. Of that total, \$16,036 is undesignated. There were several designated memorials that no longer fit the needs of the church. The committee will discuss alternative investments with the families who made the donations.

Stewardship: There have been 30 applications for the \$500.00 Youth Ministries trainees.

Outreach: The committee met May 3 and arrived at the following suggestions:

 Bring a Friend Sunday – June 12. Door prizes for guests and children attending

- Encourage attendance "online". Pastor will recognize those who have been watching online.
 - Also include mentions in the monthly newsletter
- ELC will lead Worship at the Adair Co. Fair on Sunday, July 24, at 8:30 a.m.
- Study group for the TV Series "The Chosen" will be formed later this summer or early fall.
- The Adair County Ministerial Group is running low on emergency benevolence funds. Maybe we should consider donating as part of our benevolence program.
- There appears to be a feral cat problem in Fontanelle, perhaps there is a way the church could assist Fontanelle in resolving.

Old Business:

The council reviewed the proposal for an Aesthetics Committee as follows:

Mission: Review proposals and how they would impact our church culture, and the appeal/appearance of our church to the congregation, perspective members, and the community.

- Take into consideration church history
- Identify rewards/impacts of changes.

Reports to: Church Council

- Provide information and background to the Church Council or it's representative committees/ministries on changes to the church property (church proper, parsonage, grounds), ministry teams, community needs.
- Make recommendations for Church Council consideration

Responsibilities:

- Review proposed aesthetic changes (including paint colors, furniture, adornments and/or decorations)
- Consider church history, congregational desires, and future goals to
 - Assist Memorial Committee in acceptance of gifts
 - Assist Property Committee in determining project specifics
 - Assist Church Council in the retirement of church property

Discussion followed. Motion to approve by Dan Berg, seconded by Gini Herr and approved.

New Business:

- 1. Discussion on the proposed fence that will replace the trees/shrubs around the parsonage to be a privacy fence. Consensus was to approve, with additional costs to be raised outside of the original budget.
- 2. Pastor will discuss organizing a "spring cleaning" day with the Altar Guild. We haven't had a "deep clean" since Covid restrictions were in place.

Motion to adjourn at 6:30 pm by Bill Ernst, seconded by Samantha Gettler, and approved.

President Gross closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.
