FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"I am the true vine and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful." John 15:1-2

We are in a season of pruning. As Christians and as a church. We used to average about 150 people a week at worship services at Emmanuel, but right now we are averaging 40-50 a week. Now, I know that many people are watching from home, but I am doubtful that we are making up that extra hundred. We receive much less in the weekly offering and our weekly GROW videos are receiving fewer and fewer views. The truth is that the Covid-19 virus has changed many things for us and made it much more difficult to stay connected to our community. For many people, they have fallen out of the habit not only of churchgoing but of any type of spiritual connection to God. And Jesus appears to be saying that this is a good thing!

Grapevines are pruned every year in February or early March so that they can bear the most fruit come Spring and Summer. After their foliage has been trimmed way back, they are prepared to grow even more fruitful. At first, it might look like the gardener has overdone it and almost killed the plant. However, it's the pruning that allows the growth to happen. In the same way, I believe that God is using this time to grow our church and our faith in Jesus. Right now, it looks very sad and depressing. It can feel like we are almost dead! And yet God has a future in mind for us. Once this time of trial is ended, we will be ready to join together again in growing the kingdom of God!

We are followers of a God who brings life out of death. 1st Samuel 2 makes the point clearly, "The Lord brings death and makes alive; He brings down to the grave and raises

up. The Lord sends poverty and wealth, He humbles and He exalts." When life begins to return back to normal, you might find yourself inspired in a way that you never have been before. People will come to church not because they feel like the are supposed to but because they have really missed it over the past year! And those who have fallen away from their faith and from the church will need to take inventory of what they were placing their faith in after all. If worshipping God is only a priority when it's easy, perhaps, we have missed the point of being a Christ follower?

It's nineteen degrees today and it feels almost toasty outside! How is that possible? Because it's been below zero for so long that even a little improvement seems like a big deal. Imagine what life is going to feel like when we don't have to wear masks all of the time or when our church is full again! Those things weren't that big of a deal a year ago, but we have spent so long socially distancing and in a mindset of mitigating viral spread that just being free of that will feel like we've been released from a jail cell! God has called us to be faithful during the good times and the bad. What's amazing is that sometimes we need to have the bad times in order to appreciate the good!

I believe that God has pruned us and is preparing us for a season of growth and fruitfulness! While church services have definitely changed, God's Word is the same today, yesterday and forever. God is as much with us now as He has ever been. Jesus' love and forgiveness is still life changing. The dead of Winter is almost past and the new life of Spring is just around the corner. I look forward to seeing how God works in your life and in the life of Emmanuel as He calls us out of the grave and into His future. Amen.



This year has been so very different for G.R.O.W. Steven and I have been recording G.R.O.W. each Wednesday and sending packets to the G.R.O.W. kids enrolled - but, it's just not the same. The lights aren't on all over the building, the sounds of joy and laughter aren't filling the building, it's just the two of us in the building instead of a whole heap of people, and it is sometimes hard to find the motivation to do the recordings as we wonder if anyone is even using them. So, why do we do it? Because teaching children about Jesus and His love for them is one of the single most important things we do! This year continues to be so very different. But, God is not different and He has not changed. He goes before us, behind us, and He hems us in. This pandemic did not catch Him by surprise. He is working through us even in the midst of this!
