FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Some of you might have noticed that I stopped using Facebook almost a year ago. I only get on to do things for the church such as the weekly Facebook Live Bible Study or various events like Sunday worship. I am also going to be getting off of Twitter. These social media platforms are a lot of fun sometimes and a great way to hear about events and reconnect with people, but what I noticed was that, for me personally, I experienced a lot of stress from reading various people's posts. Most people posted uplifting or fun ideas or stories, but there were several people who posted things that would just upset me for one reason or another. While a part of me, even now, still wants to see what I am missing out on, I decided to stop using these resources because they were making my life unhappy. I was inspired by the following scripture passage:

"Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things." (Philippians 4:8)

Not everyone has a problem with Facebook and Twitter so please don't take this as an indictment against these apps. You may find a lot of joy by using them! But, for me, I realized that scrolling down every day, or even just once a week, made me unhappy and upset much of the time. There are many things in my life that I cannot control and I simply have to trust God to help me in all circumstances, but dealing with social media was one area that I could choose to change my habits and it really has made a positive difference.

There are probably a lot of things in your life that you also can't control, but that verse from Philippians chapter 4 makes me wonder if we might have more control over our

happiness than we might normally think we do. Who do you surround yourself with? What do you spend your time reading? What do you spend your time listening to? If we continue to feed into the anger and drama that fills our world right now, should we expect anything less than an anger and drama filled mind and heart? However, if we fill our lives with uplifting music, inspirational books and supportive friends, we might find ourselves more uplifted, inspired and supported. God encourages us to fill our lives with things that lift us up so that we can be a light in the darkness of the lives of others. This doesn't mean that we ONLY listen to Christian music, read the Bible and hang out at church of course; however, have you ever considered how much those positive influences have a positive effect on your life?

Sin is a part of our lives that we will never be rid of. People are going to betray us, slander us and disappoint us. Circumstances are going to leave us unhappy and hopeless sometimes. We are going to hear about awful tragedies and read about how things are falling apart all around us. But God encourages us to seek out the joy, the truth and the admirable things that are ALSO happening all around us. This will give us hope even in the middle of challenging times. And that is something that I need and that I believe all of us to hear more about, read more about and talk more about with others not just for our personal mental health, but for our spiritual health.

I pray that you see God's hands all around you and that your life is filled with little God stories about how He is working in you and in the lives of others. Because He is there. No doubt about it. Sometimes we just need to stop focusing on the darkness in order to see the light. Amen.

E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES-08/8/2021

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm by President Matt Gross

Present were Matt Gross, Craig Plymesser, Bill Ernst, Dan Dreyer, Iris Westphal, Raedeen Bigelow, Nellie Griffith, Samantha Gettler, and Dan Berg. Guest: George Feazell.

Pastor Steve B. opened the meeting with a devotion around Proverbs 3; 5 and a prayer.

The minutes of the July 11th council meeting were read. Consensus to approve as corrected.

The treasurer's report was given by Bill E. Bill reviewed income and expenses and noted that the balance was low due to the benevolence checks being sent. Discussion followed. Bill received written notification from the bank that the PPP loan for \$20,118.35 was forgiven as expected, and the EIDL grant of \$8,000.00 is truly considered a grant. No repayment needed. George Feazell led a discussion on how to fund the plaster repair work in the sanctuary, and -Confirmation the work on the parsonage fence. Motion to approve the treasurer's report by Dan D., seconded by Nellie G. and approved.

Pastor's report: Raedeen B. motioned to approve, seconded by Iris W., and carried.

Pastor Steve reported one request for emergency benevolence was granted for a utility bill of \$246.00

Committee Reports:

Women of the ELCA: Volunteers have stepped forward to assist with funeral lunches.

Alter Guild: Everything is going fine.

Property: Dan reported that the carpet on the front steps remains to be installed. He will call the contractor again.

Dan and Matt reported that the congregational approved estimate for the repair work in the sanctuary did not include painting as previously thought. They are working on correcting that estimate, and have received a second estimate from another vendor as well. The contractor will be determined at the next council meeting.

There was discussion about replacing the speakers, screen, and projector in the sanctuary before doing the repair work. Matt will ask the technical committee to investigate and submit a recommendation to the council.

Dan D. reported he had received an estimate from Bob Jacobson for installing new wifi capable thermostats. Thermostats would be enclosed in a locked casing, with phone numbers to call for assistance. Dan D. moved to accept the estimate, Craig P. seconded, and motion was approved.

All of the steel chairs in the Parish Hall have been removed.
