# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Several months ago, I was leading a Bible study over the book of Genesis and I came across a statement that struck me as being pretty profound and yet it was something I had read over multiple times before without a second thought. I don't think that most people even notice this passage, but when I thought about it, something changed about my understanding of God, prayer and my sense of time as a Christian. It comes from the twenty-fifth chapter starting at verse 19, "Abraham became the father of Isaac, and Isaac was forty years old when he married Rebekah daughter of Behtuel the Aramean from Paddan Aram and sister of Laban the Aramean. Isaac prayed to the Lord on behalf of his wife, because she was barren. The Lord answered his prayer and his wife Rebekah became pregnant."

Isaac married Rebekah when he was forty. She struggled to conceive. Isaac prayed. God answered. End of story. The next few verses talk about the twins, Jacob and Esau. However, what got my attention was verse twenty-six after the boys were born, "Isaac was sixty years old when Rebekah gave birth to them [the twins]." Did you notice what that said? Isaac married Rebekah when he was forty. He had the twins when he was sixty. They had to wait TWENTY YEARS to have those children! And yet all the Bible says about that wait was this: "Isaac prayed to the Lord on behalf of his wife, because she was barren. The Lord answered his prayer and his wife Rebekah became pregnant." What about the TWENTY YEAR WAIT !? Isn't that a REALLY long time!? I mean, put that in the context of your life and maybe you can see what I am talking about.

because of downsizing at your company. You pray that God would provide a new job and God answers your prayers and you get a new job . . . twenty years later! Does that FEEL like an answered prayer?! Or how about this: You are diagnosed with cancer. You pray that God would heal you and God answers your prayers by healing you from the cancer . . . twenty years later! Does that feel like an answered prayer? I would be pretty angry if it took that long! Most of the time, if God doesn't answer my prayer within the first month of praying, then I figure that the answer must have been no. But what if my expectations are completely different than God's? What if God is currently working on things that we have given up on long ago?

When I was a kid, people wrote letters. If you asked a question in a letter, you would write the question and then wait a long time to get your answer. It would be at least a week before you ever had even a chance of a response. Now, when someone doesn't respond to a text immediately, we get frustrated at having to wait so long! People today complain about air travel because of too many delays even though it takes only six hours to fly from New York to California. A hundred years ago, it would have taken years to travel from New York to California and half of the people you were traveling with would have been dead by the time you got there! Our perception of time is completely warped and our patience is razor thin. We don't just expect God to answer our prayers, we expect immediate gratification or else we blame God for not paying attention to us!

Is there something that you have prayed for and given up on because God

Motion to approve minutes as read was made by Dan Dreher and seconded by Bill Ernst. Motion carried. George Feazell presented the Treasurer's report. Samantha Gettler moved to approve the treasurer's report and Dan Berg seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Discussion on maintenance of the Parish Hall ladies bathroom, replacing screws in the front pews, and repairs to the bathrooms upstairs.

**Children's Ministry:** Average attendance at GROW is approx. 40. 96 boxes for Operation Christmas Child were delivered. 17 boxes were distributed to college students for finals week. Denise Bridges gave an update on programs and will publish her report in the next newsletter. **Memorial:** N/R

**Stewardship:** The committee made 2023 budget recommendations as follows:

to fund 5 camp counselor stipends at \$500.00 ea.

to fund "The Well" project with a goal of \$5,000.00. (As presented by Ryan Kowlessar)

There was support from the council for the recommendations. Discussion followed on the Vision Fund recipients and funding as well as our quarterly Benevolence recipients and amounts.

Craig Plymesser motioned that the finance committee\* review the stewardship recommendations and amounts, review our current Benevolence charities and amounts, and to consider a request from a LCMC mission church in Cedar Rapids. Seconded by Dan Berg. Carried. \*Gini Herr, George Feazell, Matt Gross and Bill Ernst will meet Monday, December 12, and come back with a recommendation for the January council meeting.

### New Business:

- The Emmanuel Lutheran Church Annual Meeting was set for January 15, 9:30 am.
- Nominating Committee report: Only one person has expressed interest thus far.
- Council approved Denise Bridges to serve as the substitute Pastor on January 1.
- Compensation for guest pastors was discussed. A motion was made to change the policy to read that guest pastors are paid \$150.00 per Sunday and the current mileage rate for mileage by Dan Dreher, seconded by Dan Berg. Motion carried.
- A member has offered to replace the wooden children's chairs upstairs. Council accepted the offer. Denise Bridges will remove the old wooden chairs.

Motion to adjourn at 7:02 p.m. was made by Bill Ernst and seconded by Samantha Gettler. The motion carried. President Gross closed the meeting with the Lord's prayer.
