## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God." (Ephesians 2:8)

Why is Grace such a difficult concept for us to live out? It should be so easy. Grace can be defined in many different ways, but it is always the same concept. "Unmerited favor", "Unconditional love", or "Forgiveness with no strings attached". But however you define it, grace is notoriously misunderstood both in how we receive it and how we give it.

I recently learned about the idea of giving every adult citizen in the United States \$1000 a month for the rest of their lives. It's called Universal Basic Income, Now, on the surface, you might think that everyone would like that; however, while most people like the idea, they aren't sure if everyone should receive it.

People ask, "But would Jeff Bezos, the CEO of Amazon, get \$1000 a month too? He is already too rich and doesn't really need it!" The answer is yes he would receive it. Others ask, "But if you give that much money to people without a job, couldn't they just choose to stay home and play video games?" The answer is yes, they could choose to do that too. Others ask, "But what if you give it to someone and they just spend it on drugs?!" The answer? That's their choice. Other people question

whether it should be allowed to be saved, or allowed to be invested, or allowed to be spent or allowed to be given away? Every time the answer is the same: People are free to do with the money whatever they choose. It's not based on need or merit. If you are an adult citizen it's just yours with no strings attached.

When I first heard about this concept, I thought that it was a great example of what grace would look like here on Earth. But, of course, it is considered a very radical idea! We like rules, not grace. We get nervous when we can't find the strings. We want to feel like we deserve what we receive (good or bad) and that others deserve what they get as well.

In his book The Cost of Discipleship, the Lutheran theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer argued that if God's forgiveness is just handed out without expecting obedience, repentance and church discipline it would be "Cheap Grace". But grace isn't just cheap, it's actually completely FREE!!! Completely free for us even though it cost Jesus much on the cross with His innocent suffering and death. God paid the price for us, so that we might receive His Grace unconditionally.

What are the reactions that people have to God's grace? You might recognize a pattern. "Would people who

never come to church be allowed to receive God's grace?" The answer is yes. "But what about really good people. Certainly they don't need as much grace as everyone else do they?" Yes, actually, they need just as much. "But what if someone receives God's grace and just goes and starts doing drugs?!" That's their choice. "But what if it's a little baby and they don't understand what grace really means yet?" Well, yes, it's for them too! But what if they don't respond the right way or what if God's grace doesn't lead to enough good works or what if they don't share that same grace with others? Again, there are no strings attached. When we put our faith in Jesus Christ to save us, we are forgiven purely by God's grace.

We can't earn it before we receive it any more than we can work to deserve it after we are given it. It's unmerited and unconditional. And it is for all of God's children, all future citizens of His heavenly kingdom! Through faith in Jesus Christ, God's grace is for YOU. Amen.

The Secretary's Report was read. A correction was made to take out the information about a mission trip for high school students planned for July 21, 2019. That trip has been cancelled. Motion by Raedeen B. to approve the minutes as corrected. 2nded by Iris W. Carried.

Treasurer's Reports were presented by George F. Motion by Iris W. to approve the reports. 2nded by Leo W. Carried.

Pastor Broers gave his monthly activities and mileage report. Motion by Raedeen B. to approve. 2nded by Bart B. Carried.

Vicar Tony gave his monthly activities and mileage report. Motion by Leo W. to approve. 2nded by Lynn C. Carried.

Emergency Benevolence: \$200 given to help with rent. Motion by Iris W. to approve 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Benevolence. 2nded by Bart B. Carried. Ministry Reports:

Women of ELCA—Eight women met with Pastor Broers on July 3, 2019 for the monthly meeting of LCMC women. Pastor Broers led the bible study from the Gather book titled For Just Such As This with references from the book of Ester, with all participating. Secretary and Treasurer Reports were given and approved. A letter from Paulette Lutz was read, thanking us for the donation given to her. We decided to meet next Wednesday afternoon to tie the quilt to be sent to Story City auction with the returning teachers here for the annual Bible School. We will send \$100 to Okaboji for their bible camp fund raiser. There were no birthdays to celebrate. Arlene read an article from Rick Warren titled "Why You Need Others". An offering was taken. The Lord's Prayer and table prayer were recited before lunch was served. Irma Jacobson Property:

All cast iron pipes have been removed from the upstairs bathroom in the church.

Replaced old water heater in the basement. Removed small water heater under sink in kitchen (not functioning). Some venting had to be redone on outside of the church building.

Sewer gas problem should be resolved now. Some drains still not working properly.

The Jacobson family and the Huff family will be the 2 host families. Vicki Brown will help take Kristy's position as Kristy will be at a class in Ames Tuesday-Friday. We are still working on finding helpers.

Stewardship:

Working on backpacks.

Old Business:

Semi-Annual Meeting. Worked on the budget for 2020. Motion by Bart B. to submit budget to the congregation at the Semi-Annual Meeting. 2nded by Iris W. Carried. Church security. Our property insurance underwriter said the church needs to be locked overnight. Discussion on the type of system that would work the best for our situation, and also the times the church should be locked. More research will be done on this project.

There was discussion on where the free-will donations will go. LCMC National Gathering: September 29<sup>th</sup>-Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup> in Omaha, NE. Ed and Cathy Christensen are our delegates. Members of the congregation are also encouraged to go.

Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council Minutes from special meeting July 21, 2019

A special church council meeting was held in the Parish Hall. George Feazell called the meeting to order at 11:45 AM. All council members were present.

Pastor Broers gave devotions
The purpose of the meeting:

Reviewing and approving payment of a bill from Feick's Plumbing for replacing sewer pipe and vent piping to get rid of sewer gas odor in the church basement, and for replacing the church's hot water heater. The amount of the bill is \$14,419.36.

Approve authorizing council President George Feazell to sign loan and security agreement for a line of credit not to exceed \$60,000 with a term limit of one year or less and a maturity date not later than July 31, 2020. The loan will be needed for upcoming projects including mortar repair around a bathroom window at the parsonage, plaster repair to walls and ceiling in the naïve of the church, and a work day at the church to remove trees north of the church and do a general clean up of the church grounds.

Approve signature authority for the loan. Approve credit card use for the church.

Motion by Judi Raasch to pay Feick's Plumbing bill of \$14, 419.36. 2nded by Iris Westphal. Carried.

Motion by Raedeen Bigelow to authorize council president George Feazell to sign a loan and security agreement for a line of credit not to exceed \$60,000 with a term limit of one year or less and a maturity date not later than July 31, 2020. 2nded by Judi R. Carried.

Motion by Judi R. to authorize Pastor Steven Broers, church secretary, Clella Buckner, and bookkeeper, Barb Lemke to use the church credit card. 2nded Leo W. Carried.

Motion by Roland Purdy to adjourn. 2nded by Leo W. Carried. We adjourned at 12:05 PM with the Lord's Prayer. Roland Purdy, secretary


