FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Is it the "thought" that REAL-LY counts? I have a package at home that I have had in my house since the end of December. It was for my father's birthday . . . 17 days ago. I bought it two weeks early with PLENTY of time to get it sent . . . and I have thought about sending it! I THINK about it a lot in fact. Nowadays, I think about it and feel badly about it as well, but I don't actually DO it. Unfortunately, the "thought" doesn't help him to enjoy his present one little bit. I would have to SEND it in order for him to enjoy it.

The book of James makes this point in another way in chapter 2:15, "Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to him, 'Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."

There are many problems in the world today. Poverty, homelessness and violence. A degradation of morality, people losing their faith and others never having been raised with a faith to lose. People go through divorce, fight diseases and lose their loved ones to death itself. So often, we think about what we

WOULD do if we had more time. What we COULD do if we had more courage. We THINK about ways to solve these problems, but they feel out of reach and overwhelming. I really wish that it was simply the THOUGHT that counted. So many more problems would be solved. Unfortunately, thinking, worrying and fretting doesn't really do much. "Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?" Jesus asks in the gospel of Matthew. Just thinking about our problems or other people's problems doesn't really do much good in the end.

So what is the next step? When people came to John the Baptist to be baptized in the river Jordan, they repented of their sins and asked what they should do next. He said, "If you see someone in need and you have two cloaks, give one to them." Jesus said, "If you see someone who is hungry, feed them. If you see someone who is thirsty, give them something to drink." And if you have the opportunity to help even MORE people, do what you can. It is NOT all up to you to solve all of the problems of the world, but God gives us opportunities to help people in small ways so that. if we are faithful with those small tasks, we may eventually be given the responsibility to help even more people along the way.

We are, of course, still going to think about what we could do, should do and would do. And sometimes we won't do much to put those thoughts into action. But please remember that as you grow in faith, that it is NEVER up to you alone. God sends His Holy Spirit into our lives to give us the courage, the ability and the strength to do all things! He DESIRES that we put our faith into action because that is what a living faith looks like. We have the seeds of faith planted in our hearts so that we might bear good fruit for the sake of our neighbor and our world. It is really fun to think about what that might look like in our lives and in the life of our conaregation, but it would be even more wonderful if we ACTED on those wonderful thoughts!

"Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine; according to His power that is at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen. " (Ephesians 3:20-21)

Emergency Benevolence—None.

Ministry Reports:

Altar Guild—There was discussion on communion at the Contemporary Service. Pastor Broers suggested using individual cups for the wine as a more sanitary method, rather than the intinction method. The council decided to try the individual cups for a few Sundays.

Property—Jerry Holan is stopping work on repairing the plaster walls of the sanctuary until after January 1st because of funerals and the holiday season. Children's Ministry Report--December 2019

Many thanks to Louise Johnson who hauled all the boxes to the drop-off spot in Stuart and to the congregation for their support and donations. -The G.R.O.W. shirts were passed out this past week. - As of the end of November, 59 sheep have been sponsored! Thanks you to all the sponsors!

-Confirmation

-The confirmation kids decorated cookies and took them to the Good Samaritan Center when they went caroling this past Wednesday.

-High School

-The high school youth decorated the Christmas tree this past Wednesday and then had fun playing games at church to finish off the night.

-Children's Ministry

-The Christmas program dress rehearsal will be held soon. We have struggled to have enough kids, so have asked 3 confirmation volunteers to help out.

-There is no G.R.O.W./Confirmation/High School Bible Study during winter vacation.

Memorial—The church's new Christmas tree was purchased with money from Ervin and Ione Ehm memorial. The tree topper was purchased with money from Janice Thompson memorial.

Stewardship—Letters were sent out to all church members concerning pledges and church offerings. Outreach—Pastor Broers' Youtube videos are being well received. He has 23 subscribers so far. He has created 7 videos on devotions that averaged 41 views, 5 Sunday Sermon Previews that averaged 23 views, and 1 subject video that had 46 views.

Old Business:

Grinnell Mutual Reinsurance Co. has given us permission to sign the Memorandum of Understanding from Adair County Emergency Management allowing our church facility to be used as a shelter in the event of an emergency. Motion by Raedeen B. to sign the MOU memorandum. 2nded by Lynn C. Carried.

Pastor Broers announced he is planning a seder meal for sometime in April next year. There will also be a speaker. He will have more details later.

There are plans for a new church directory in the works. Clella Buckner has volunteered to be in charge.

George F. passed out Pastor Review forms to all council members. He needs the forms turned in by December 21. The Annual Meeting will be held on January 19, 2020 at 1:00 PM, with a potluck meal prior to the meeting at 12:00 noon.

Church budget—no changes.

Financial Reports due January 9th.

Discussion Item—Locking the church at night.

Year End Benevolence—Motion by Lynn Č. to authorize the benevolence committee to pay 4th quarter benevolence based on estimated giving by the end of the year. 2nded by Raedeen B. Carried.

Financial Review—George F will meet with Gini Herr for a review of the church's finances prior to the annual meeting.

George F. asked for approval to pay bonuses to Pastor Broers and other church employees. Motion by Raedeen B. to pay Pastor Broers \$500, Clella Buckner, Christy Queck, & Mike Mangels \$100 each. 2nded by Roland Purdy. Carried.
