### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"It was He who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.' Ephesians 4:12-13

One of the struggles I have had as a parent is when to expect my children to start doing things on their own. When my kids are in Kindergarten, making them a peanut butter and jelly sandwich makes a lot of sense, but sometimes I don't realize when I am still doing it as they are starting to drive themselves to school! Children want a lot of freedom to do whatever they want while at the same time not various types of leaders in the church all are taking responsibility to do the things that they are completely capable of. But adults are very much like this at times as well. Even at church.

Sometimes we get stuck doing the same things at church that we did as a child. Not because we aren't capable of doing more, but because we just accept that someone else will do it for us. This isn't healthy for us or for our faith just like it isn't healthy for a high schooler to have their parent still making their sandwiches. We want to mature in our faith just like we mature in every other area of life.

What does maturity look like for a person of faith? It means listening to the weekly messages. It means getting involved in church activities whether it is through helping in worship or with a ministry team. It means giving of your time, talents and treasures. It means taking an active role in the ministry rather than being passive.

When my children were little, we gave them each a quarter to put in the offering plate. As they have grown older, they put in at

least a dollar every week. When they get a paycheck, they put in 10%. We hope that when they become adults, they will have learned to do this on their own. But how many members of our church still act like children in their giving by giving spare change or a couple bucks?

When my children were in Confirmation, they read once or twice a year at church. As they have become older, they started serving at Luther League events and helping at community events. When they become adults, we hope that they will lead ministry groups and come up with ways to help on their own. But how many members don't get involved in the ministry of the church at all?

In the reading from Ephesians, the called for the same purpose: prepare God's people for works of service. That means that even if you are NOT a church leader, you are called to service. That was what every Sunday school teacher was preparing you for. That's why you were Confirmed and became a part of High School Ministry. If you haven't taken advantage of your gifts, now is the time! Your ideas, your talents and your time are important parts not only of your own spiritual maturity but also for the expansion of God's kingdom and growth of Emmanuel as a church.

How might you become involved? We are looking for an Outreach leader and members of that team. We are looking for an Adult Ministry leader and members of that team as well. We have lots of opportunities to help with worship, Children's ministry and the Property team. Talk to Pastor Broers or any Council member about how to serve and live out the life that a mature Christian is called to live. Amen
