### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I was a big soccer fan as a child. I played in soccer camps throughout elementary school and was a part of indoor soccer leagues as well throughout the winter up in Minnesota. Because I played goalie, I had special pants, a special jersey and expensive goalie gloves as well. I read all kinds of books about soccer and even had a subscription to Soccer Digest! My favorite player was the goalie for the Professional MLS team the Minnesota Strikers named Tino Letteri. I knew everything about him.

Then one day, I walked past a guy who looked just like him. I ran to my dad and said, "I think that's Tino Letteri! I really do! That's Tino Letteri!" I was so nervous to go speak to him. I ran back and forth trying to build up the courage to say a word to him. Finally, I ran up, tapped him on the shoulder and asked, "Are you Tino Letteri?" He said, "Yes I am." Then I blurted out, "YOU'RE MY BIGGEST FAN!" and I ran back to my father exhilarated! Eventually, when I realized what I had said and what an idiot I must have looked like, I felt embarrassed and didn't want to meet him again. But my dad went and talked to him and I had a longer conversation a few days later. I eventually worked for him at the Renaissance Faire since he owned a little shop there to sell Panzarottis (calzone-like pastries).

Did I know a lot about Tino Letteri? Yes, but meeting him was much different than knowing all about him in my head. Building a relationship with him ended up being a lot more difficult than I had originally expected. Communicating with him needed to be a twoway street and that was going to take some time. In the same way, I think that many of you may know a lot about Jesus, but haven't really taken the scary and yet extremely important step of building a relationship with your Lord and Savior. Do you only talk to the Lord or do you take time to listen to what He has to say back? Have you ever been in awe of being in God's presence? Or do you simply "know" Him from afar and stay His "biggest fan" rather than taking the time to become

His friend?

I have learned a lot about the Bible and about what others have thought about God. I have studied the great theologians of Christianity over the centuries while at seminary and I continue to read books about how to best impact the world on behalf of the kingdom of God. Every week, I write sermons to try to explain how the Biblical witness affects our lives and how the gospel of Jesus Christ changes the life of every person who puts their faith in Him. And yet, I do not believe that knowing more about God gets us any closer to our heavenly goal. We are saved by faith in Jesus Christ alone. And that means that we each need to focus on building a relationship with Jesus.

The message of Easter is that God saved us ALL BY HIMSELF. He didn't need us to choose Him. He died on the cross for our sins because we did NOT choose Him. So then why do we read our Bibles or do Bible studies? Why do we read devotionals or go to Christian conferences or read books about God? Because God's love for us has inspired us to want to learn more about Him: to know the depth and width and height of His love for us. But no matter how much we learn and study and talk about God, we never get past the need to truly KNOW Him rather than just knowing ABOUT Him.

How might you grow to know Jesus? Start by getting to know His friends. Ask others how they have come to know Jesus. How do they communicate with Him? Then spend time in His presence at church or reading the Bible or listening to Christian radio or praying. Getting to meet Jesus is a completely different experience compared to learning about Him, but it is worth it! It's scary to think that maybe we have been missing something important even after coming to church for so long, but perhaps that's how much time it took to realize how important a relationship with the Savior actually is. Don't settle for just knowing about Jesus this Easter season. Get to know the man who died for you. Amen.

Pastor Broers opened the meeting with devotions from Matthew 6 – don't worry about your life.

Craig read the minutes from the December 11 council meeting. Motion to approve minutes as corrected was made by Dan Berg and seconded by Samantha Gettler. Motion carried.

Gini Herr presented the Treasurer's report. All finances are in excellent condition. David Huff moved to approve the treasurer's report and Bill Ernst seconded the motion. Motion carried.

George Feazell presented the revised 2023 budget which included funding for the Youth Minister position. Dave Huff motioned, and Dan Dreher seconded that the council recommend the revised budget at the annual meeting. Carried

Discussion followed on benevolence giving. ### IA DISTRICT LCMC REPORT-NOV. 2022 & FEB. 2023

Recently, I was nominated and elected as one of seven board members for the Iowa District of the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC). Once elected, I was nominated and elected as the secretary for the board. The board usually meets about five times throughout the year either over Zoom or in person to discuss how to encourage Iowa LCMC congregations.

LCMC is the association of Lutheran congregations to which Emmanuel belongs and the Iowa District is a group of Iowa churches within that association that work together to support one another and build up the kingdom of God within our region. The Iowa District meets at least twice a year in various churches around the state for conferences. They hold an annual conference and a leadership conference to support pastors and leaders to do ministry in their local congregations. Currently, there are sixty-seven LCMC congregations in Iowa and thirty-five of them are voting members within the district.

The annual meeting was held at Zion Lutheran in Clear Lake on November 12, 2022 and our speaker for the day was Julie Smith who is one of the staff members for LCMC as the coordinator of districts and fellowships. She spoke to us about the importance of small groups in churches and

how to get them started. She also talked about the importance of a holistic understanding to ministry so that we take care of ourselves better as pastors and leaders. There was a lot of discussion about mental health and about a LeaderCare conference that is beginning in the Spring to help pastors and their families deal with the physical, mental and emotional stresses of their vocation.

The leadership conference was held at Bethlehem Lutheran in Buffalo Center on February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Our speaker was Chris Fiske who is both an LCMC pastor and an Iowa Army National Guard Chaplain. He spoke about suicide awareness and prevention as well as effectively structuring pastor salary packages and creating sustainable funding for congregations. He provided some great resources for how to recognize people who are in need of emotional support and how to best provide help.

The conferences have been a great way to get to know other pastors and connect with the larger church within the state of lowa. I felt very encouraged and inspired by the speakers and it was a great way to build up relationships with other pastors and congregations to work with in the future.
