FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." (Galatians 5:22-23)

When we put our faith in Jesus Christ and are baptized in the name of the Triune God, the Holy Spirit comes and makes a home in us. He plants Himself in our hearts and our life begins to change. You might not even notice it at first, but God starts working in you and through you. The way that Galatians chapter five explains this is by relating it to how a plant will grow and produce fruit. We begin to produce fruit through the work of the Holy Spirit.

Of course, each one of these seven characteristics is important and could be the focus of an entire sermon let alone a newsletter article. But I feel led to write specifically about the fruit of kindness. I believe that this particular attribute has been losing ground more than any other among Christians since I was a child. I am not sure why this has happened. Maybe kindness just isn't as flashy as joy or as often talked about as love; however, I believe that kindness is much more important than we give it credit for.

Recently, I was reading a book titled *Humankind* by Rutger Bregman. One of his main arguments is that the ability to be kind and get along with others gives humanity an advantage over other species. Furthermore, humans that are kind to one another have a built in advantage over other people who do not act this way. We have probably all heard the saying, "Nice guys finish last." However, according to Bregman, historically that really isn't true at all.

I am always praying that God would give me more ways of helping the congregation think about making disciples because I truly believe that this should be what we are focused on more than anything else as a Christian community. Perhaps we have overlooked a simple but powerful tool that we have access to as believers in Jesus: kindness.

Who would you be more interested in listening to? Someone who talks over you or someone who is interested in listening to what you have to say? Who would you want to hang out with? Someone who bullies others and makes fun of them or someone who is pleasant and encouraging? Who would you respect more? Someone who is angry and swearing all the time or someone who finds peace in situations and whose words are uplifting? You might not realize that kindness opens doors for you to share your faith with others. You might not realize that kindness matters to people more than even your best theological arguments. So then, why don't we focus on it more?

When we watch sitcoms, we laugh when the characters make fun of people; but in real-life, nobody wants to get made fun of and their feelings are real. In movies, the heroes or heroines are often admired because of their tough attitudes; but in real life, people who would act that way will soon find that they have few friends. Stories abound about Hollywood stars, professional athletes and famous people who are notorious for their bad attitudes. And because these people are so talented, they often get away with being unkind. But as Christians, we are called to be different.

The American philosopher Dr. Wayne W. Dyer has a wonderful quote that I believe Jesus would endorse whole-heartedly, "If you have the choice between being right and being kind, choose being kind." Being kind will not only bless your life but bless the lives of the people in your life. Amen.

Pastor Steve presented the devotions centered on building disciples. The 3 key steps are approval, appetite, and ambition.

Craig Plymesser read the minutes from the April 16 council meeting. Motion to approve minutes as read was made by Iris Westphal and seconded by Dan Berg. Motion carried.

Gini Herr presented the Treasurer's report. Funding for the parsonage fence was discussed with income from Vision Fund. Income is falling behind projected income. Discussion followed on how to discuss with the congregation at the semiannual meeting in July.

Council is to review the Vision Fund suggested budget items at the next council meeting.

Louise Johnson moved to approve the treasurer's report and Samantha Gettler seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There were no requests for emergency benevolence funds.

Pastor gave his report. Motion to approve report and expenses by Gini Herr, seconded by Roger Jensen. Approved

Ministry Reports:

Women of the ELC: Moving their monthly meeting date to the 2nd Wednesday of the month.

Altar Guild: Everything is moving smoothly.

Property: Roger reported that Rod McMorran will be reseeding the parsonage lawn this fall. There is a hole in the new parsonage fence, which Roger will investigate. He also reviewed applying epoxy paint to the basement floors. Color choices to be submitted to the Aesthetics committee. Roger met with the Memorial Committee which approved funds for the basement floor. The project should only take 3 days with firm scheduling to be announced. Repairs were made to the sink in the men's bathroom. **Music and Worship:** N/R

Children's Ministry: Her full report will be in the newsletter. Additional funding will be needed for Vacation Bible School since the Fontanelle Methodist will no longer be able to assist. Camp registration is progressing nicely with 14 registered thus far. The GROW celebration was well attended with over 100 there. It was much appreciated that congregation members were there to socialize with nonmembers.

Memorial: A request will be made of the committee to fund the shortfall in VBS funding.

Old Business:

George Feazell presented the recommendations for new computers and a maintenance agreement. The council agreed with the recommendation and

consensus was to move ahead. Old computers will be recycled.

New Business:

- The council received a proposal to replace the exterior and interior doors to the Parish Hall with automatic doors. Discussion followed with concern about implications for meeting Fire Code with the rest of the building. More information will be sought and then presented at the semiannual meeting for congregation consideration.
- Council received a request to return to the practice of "Passing the Peace" during the services. After much discussion, Roger Jensen made a motion to not continue the practice, seconded by Louise Johnson. Carried.
- The council reviewed property insurance considerations and will further investigate. Our current insurer will no longer insure the building because of it's age. Recommendations will be presented at the semiannual meeting.
- Retention of Records. The council agreed to continue with the existing policy for keeping church records.
- The council reviewed the list of confirmands for confirmation.
