FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

There is a wonderful contemporary Christian song written by the group Casting Crowns titled Praise You in the Storm. The chorus says, "I will praise you in this storm and I will lift my hands. For you are who you are no matter where I am. And every tear I cry you hold in your hands. You've never left my side. And though my heart is torn, I will praise you in this storm." There will always be storms in our lives. Sometimes they will take the form of tornados and floods like the state of Iowa and our community has experienced so recently. But sometimes the storms will look a bit different even though they are just as upsetting: difficult medical diagnoses, economic downturns, layoffs and breakups.

When the disciples were in a boat facing a storm once, Jesus got up, rebuked the wind and told the waves to "Be still." Jesus promised that when troubles came into our lives, we could always find peace in Him, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world, you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33) Saint Paul said the secret to finding peace in all situations was finding your strength in Jesus, "I have learned the secret of being content in any situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through Christ who gives me strength." (Philippians 4:12-13)

I pray that you are all doing really well right now. That you are in good health and happy. That you are enjoying the freedom of summertime with your family and/or friends. That you feel secure in God's love. But soon enough, that contentment is bound to be disrupted. There will be some event or situation that makes you feel like everything is falling apart. You will become anxious. You will doubt God's love. But when that time comes, I want you to remember this: God is still with you.

God's love for you never changes. The book of Hebrews tells us that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." Your circumstances WILL change. Sometimes they

will get better and sometimes they will get worse. But because of your faith in Jesus, you have a foundation of joy that cannot be shaken even though your happiness might momentarily be taken away, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1st Thessalonians 5:16-18) As people and as a church, we always have so much to be thankful for even during difficult times.

I have been thinking a lot about how wonderful Emmanuel Lutheran Church is. God is at work in so many people. At VBS, lots of young people were singing, dancing and praying all to glorify God! We have adults of all ages helping out at worship in reading scripture, running our technology, singing in the praise team and showing others hospitality between services. Five people joined our church last Sunday because they want to be a part of what God is doing here. Our secretary and youth minister Denise Bridges has been doing an excellent job organizing youth events and helping our church to run smoothly in its day-to-day affairs. I have seen and heard of people who are continuing to help people recover from the tornado damage even as the rest of the world moves on to the next disaster. We are very blessed.

But I know that it's always easier to see blessings during good times. How will it feel when the next storm comes? We can prepare ourselves during these times of rest physically, emotionally and spiritually to be prepared for the next time life gets turned upside down. Now is the time to seek growth in your relationship with God. To remind yourself of His promises and build a firm foundation on Jesus. That way, when the next storm comes, you will be ready to face it. You will be confident of His love and assured that Jesus has promised to be faithful to you through every situation and circumstance. Jesus has promised that He is not just here at Emmanuel Lutheran Church but He truly IS Emmanuel: God with us. During good times and bad. Amen. Pastor Broers

The regular council meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Roger Jensen. Present: George Feazell, Raedeem Bigelow, Rhonda Boehm, Iris Westphal, Gini Herr, Roger Jensen, John Baudler, and Pastor Steven Broers. Absent: Judy Albers, Louise Johnson. Visitor: Denise Bridges.

Pastor Broers led devotions from Ephesians Chapter 1 about Jesus being the head of the church. Pastor challenged the Council to think about where God is leading the church in the future.

Raedeem moved to approve the minutes of the previous meetings held April 14th and Iris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

George gave the treasurer's report for the month of April. Gini moved to approve the treasurer's report and John seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Pastor presented his monthly reports along with the LCMC District and Nodaway Valley Ministerial Association updates. Raedeem moved to approve Pastor's reports and Rhonda seconded the motion. Motion carried. There were no emergency benevolence requests in April.

Confirmation Class News: The week of June 9-14, we have 5 boys from the Confirmation class attending camp at Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp. Pastor Broers will be taking them and spending the week with them at the camp.

High School Group News: On May 1, at the GROW Family Night, we recognized 7 High School Students for faithfully attending and volunteering every Wednesday at GROW. They have been so dedicated and the kids love seeing them every week.

-We have ended out weekly youth group meetings as of May 1 for the summer. Between graduation, summer jobs, camps, and sports it gets really hard to meet. I am planning events throughout the summer to help us all stay in touch.

-With the challenges that some of the High School Students have been facing since the tornado, I have been checking in with them by phone and text. They have made me very proud with the amount of volunteer work and support they have been giving the community of Greenfield.

-The NV Ministerial Association held the Graduation Baccalaureate Service at the High School on May 15 with area ministers. This year's class was 56 students and we were able to host approximately 30 members of the class.






