

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It's been a beautiful winter so far this season. It hasn't really been that cold and not much snow has fallen on the ground. We have been blessed. But the truth is that we know what is coming! There are going to be snowstorms (in fact, there might even have been one since I wrote this Newsletter article!) There are going to be frigid days ahead. Because we live in Iowa and even a mild winter has cold days. God also promises that our lives will have difficult days and difficult times no matter how blessed we are. There is a great scripture passage in 1 Peter 1:3-9 that talks about these trials in our life.

"For a little while, you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire-may be proved genuine and may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed." (1 Peter 1:6-7)

Have you ever thought of the trials in your life in this way? As something God uses to refine and prove that your faith is genuine? I think that many of us have experienced such a thing when we go through something difficult and find ourselves crying out to God for help, but then experiencing His power and presence in our lives. In fact, many people come to faith because they find God in the challenges they face

in their life. While we see obstacles and challenges in our life as problems; God seems to view them as opportunities to strengthen our faith in Jesus Christ!

I promise you that I am not looking forward to freezing temperatures, scooping snow or icy sidewalks. But I know that this kind of weather plays a role in our life here in lowa as well. The snows melt and provide needed moisture in the Springtime to replenish the water table that will help the crops grow. The storms force us to stay inside and stop working for a little while to spend important time with our family no matter what work has to be done. The cold days remind us of the blessings we live with every day: a roof over our heads, clothes to put on. heat to help us survive. We might go through life unaware of God's provisions if it were not for those hard days that remind us how loving He is to us.

In the same way, I encourage you to see the trials in your life as important as well. Nobody likes to deal with sickness or sorrow, but it's part of being alive. And God can use these circumstances to make you remember His great love, His healing touch and to experience a renewal of your faith. Keeping this mindset can also help you when your family or friends are struggling with "why" they are struggling in

their life as well. Sometimes it's hard to see any meaning in our suffering at the time, but a good friend can help us see how God uses all things for the good of those who love Him.

Eventually, the winter will be over. The Spring rains and warmer weather will return. The sun will start shining for longer each day and we will be able to wear shorts, t-shirts and flip flops again. We will be more worried about sunburns than wind chills. We will have survived another lowa winter and realize that warm weather doesn't last forever so we ought to get out and enjoy it! In the same way, I encourage you to appreciate the blessings God has given you in your life. Especially when times are going well, give Him thanks for what you have: good health, good food and great family and friends. Trials are sure to come in all of our lives, but so are joyful experiences and peaceful times.

Sometimes it takes the dark winter days to remind us of the blessings of the sun. And sometimes it takes the challenges in our life to recognize the presence of the Son, Jesus Christ our Savior.

And so much more!


