## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Take a moment, if you would, and please find your Bible and read Matthew chapter 20:1-16. This is often called "The Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard". Once you have finished, please answer the following questions: 1. Was Jesus being fair? 2. Was Jesus being kind? "But he answered one of them,

'Friend,' I am not being unfair to you. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the man who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous? So the last will be first, and the first will be last." (Matthew 20:13-16)

I think that how you interpret this parable is based a lot on your perspective. Do you see yourself as one of the workers that started at the beginning of the day or those that started at the end? If you have been born and raised in the church and are now in your eighties, you might view yourself as one of the first people called. If so, you might feel like it is rather unfair and unkind for God to treat you the same as someone who just joined the church last month. You might not like this story much at all! However, if you were only recently baptized and come to Christ, you might really LOVE this story because it makes you feel like God values you right off the bat and treats everyone the same.

However, if you consider that we are Christians now almost 2000 years after the first disciples, then in fact, we are ALL coming very late to the party! We may be some of the LAST people called into service for Christ and the parable might seem very generous and kind after all. You might recognize yourself as one of those people God has had to show much grace to, rather than one of those always ready and willing to serve from the beginning.

In our society, nobody wants to be looked down upon. We want to "stand on our own two feet". We don't want to ask for help. So the concepts of "grace", "mercy" and "generosity" are often thought of as "bad words". And yet, as Christians, they are the defining words for our life. You don't get to "stand on your own two feet" with Jesus. He would rather carry you. If you don't want to be washed in His blood, you don't get a part in His ministry. Pure people need not apply. And if you say that you have enough and don't need anything, then you will find yourself fighting against Jesus when He actually only wants to gather you close to Him to save you.

My point is this: Jesus desires that we would all be the "last" in this parable. Whether or not you grew up in the church or have lived a holy life. He wants you to realize that you will always need His mercy and generosity. Having a great investment in the stock market may make you seem rich in this world, but being poor of Spirit is how you find your treasure when it comes to heaven. Showing up early to work all day is how you get ahead on this Earth, but being called into service at the last moment is how God chooses you for your eternal life. We need to humble ourselves and leave our pride at the door when it comes to the Kingdom of God.

So don't be afraid to be called last or to be considered poor. Remember that God's generosity to others is just as unfair and undeserved and AMAZING for YOU as it is for them. And whenever you have an opportunity, share this crazy concept of grace with everyone you know so that even more people have the chance to join Jesus in the vineyard and work for the Kingdom of God! Amen.
