FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

For those of who like to make New Year's Resolutions or goals for each new year, I have an idea for you: Come to Sunday services every week next year! I know, I know, coming to church weekly doesn't prove that you are a better Christian than anyone else, but sleeping in on Sunday mornings also doesn't prove that you are more spiritual than anyone else either! Why not give it a try and see what kind of a difference it makes in your life or in the life of your family? You just might be surprised!

What biblical precedent is there for encouraging weekly worship of God? There are actually a few places you can look. The third commandment encourages us to "Remember the Sabbath Day to Keep it Holy." God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. From that point on, He encouraged His people to always set aside one day a week for not only rest from work but to focus on God. In the Small Catechism, Martin Luther explained it this way, "We are to fear and love God so that we do not despise God's word or the preaching of it, but instead, regard it as holy and gladly hear and learn it." Next year, we will be spending each Sunday going through The Bigger Story: Experiencing the Bible from beginning to end. If you want to better understand God's plan for the world and for you personally, it would be a great year to make worship attendance a priority.

The book of Hebrews also has a passage that has encouraged many Christians to attend worship more regularly: "Let us hold unwaveringly to the hope we profess for He who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some do in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day

approaching." (Hebrews 10:23-25) Church is a place where you can find encouragement not only from the Bible, but from other Christians. It's a place to build friendships that will help you through the most difficult times of life and celebrate the joyful times! Church is also a place where you are encouraged to live out your faith in practical ways. I have often heard people argue that they don't like "organized religion" but I would argue that "disorganized religion" gets even less done to help those who are in need.

Church is a place where you can be uplifted on a regular basis despite the drama and struggles that may fill your day to day life. In Philippians chapter 4 we read this: "Finally, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things." Sunday worship is one of the few places where you will hear that your sins are forgiven unconditionally and hear words of hope for your life.

Church is also a wonderful place to raise your family. Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." Kids learn more than just how to sit still for an hour and listen. They pay attention to the words they hear. They see the people of their community honoring God. They hear about how God is working in the lives of other people through God stories and they experience fellowship with other believers. "Hear O Israel: The Lord our God the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit

at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." (Deuteronomy 6:4-7)

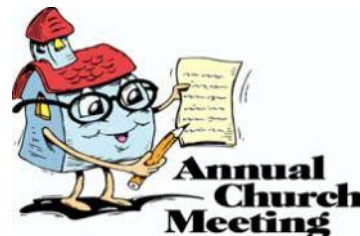
