### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:8-9)

There is a lot of freedom for a Christian. Even when we sin, we have a God who loves us so much that He will forgive us no matter what! No strings attached! When we repent of our sins, God takes away our guilt, our shame and gives us the chance to live a different way by the power of His Holy Spirit. But when you recognize God's amazing grace, an important question comes up which Saint Paul asks in the book of Romans: "Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase?" In other words, if we know that God will forgive us, why should we ever bother to stop sinning?! There are two answers to this question. The first answer deals with the Law and Its temporary, but quite effective, deterrents. The second answer deals with God's promise and how we can begin to live the new life God has created us for.

Why not just sin since you know that you will be forgiven anyway? One good reason is this: consequences. Earthly consequences. While God's grace gives us hope for eternal life through His forgiveness, sin still has terrible and destructive effects for us here on Earth.

In the book of 2<sup>nd</sup> Samuel, we hear about how King David committed both the sin of adultery and murder. He was confronted by the prophet Nathan, "Why did you despise the word of the Lord by doing what is evil in His eyes? You struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and took his wife to be your own. You killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. Now, therefore, the sword will never depart from your house, because you despised me and took the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your own." Then David confessed his sin. "Nathan replied, 'The Lord has taken away your sin. You are not going to die. But because by doing this you have made the enemies of the Lord show utter contempt, the son born to you will die." (2

Sam. 12:9-13). From this point, though David was forgiven, the Bible tells the story of how David's family falls apart. God still loves and blesses David, but listen to this litany of consequences that I recently read in my Experiencing God Day-by-Day Devotional: "The child born of David's adultery died (2 Sam. 12:14). David's son Amnon raped David's daughter Tamar (2 Sam. 13:14). David's son Absalom murdered Amnon (2 Sam. 13:28-29). Absalom brought the kingdom into rebellion (2 Sam. 15). For the rest of David's reign, violence filled his home and his kingdom. Although David knew he was forgiven, he bore the painful consequences of his sin for the rest of his life." (pg 143) Why should we refrain from sinning even though we know about God's abundant grace? Because there are often terrible consequences that we have to endure because of our sin.

But Saint Paul gives us another answer for why we stay away from sin: "We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?" (Romans 6:2) In other words, forgiveness changes us. We aren't staying away from sin because we are afraid of punishment anymore, the Holy Spirit gives us the strength to choose to live a new way! He concludes his argument by saying, "In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus." (Romans 6:11)

When you are fighting the temptation to sin remember this: "God is faithful and He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it." (1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 10:13) Sometimes you will fight sin because you realize the consequences Like Us On are not something you want to experience. Other times, you will fight sin because you recognize that God is giving you the strength to live a life free from sin and pleasing to God! Finally, if you do fall into sin, remember the greatest promise of all: nothing in all creation can separate you from the love of God in Christ Jesus! Amen.

## E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES- 4/16/2023

The regular council meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Huff. Present: David Huff, Dan Berg, Samantha Gettler, Rhonda Boehm, Iris Westphal, Roger Jensen, and Gini Herr.

Late arrivals due to a funeral: Craig Plymesser, Pastor Steve Broers.

Guests: Denise Bridges, George Feazell Absent: Louise Johnson

Gini Herr read the minutes from the March 12 council meeting. Motion to approve minutes as read was made by Dan Berg and seconded by Samantha Gettler. Motion carried. Gini Herr presented the Treasurer's report. All finances are in excellent condition. Roger Jensen moved to approve the treasurer's report and Dan Berg seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There were no requests for emergency benevolence funds.

#### Ministry Reports:

Women of the ELC: Donated \$150 to GROW to assist with their Heifer International donation.

#### Altar Guild: N/R

Property: Roger reported estimates are being obtained to reseed the parsonage lot, including leveling where the trees/ shrubs had been, and removal of the stumps.

He also reviewed estimates for applying epoxy paint to the basement floors. Color choices to be submitted to the Aesthetics committee. Roger will meet with the Memorial Committee to determine funds available for the basement floor and proceed as far as funding will allow.

#### Music and Worship: N/R

Children's Ministry: Her full report will be in the newsletter. **Memorial:** The committee has requested that a 5<sup>th</sup> person be added to the committee. Council approved adding the current Council Vice President as a permanent addition to the Memorial Committee as both a member, and connection to the council for implementation of requests.

Denise Bridges reported that new chairs for upstairs classrooms have not yet been ordered, due to lack of inventory, but will be ordered as soon as available. Chairs will be purchased by a private donation.

#### Stewardship: N/R

#### Adult ministries: N/R

Outreach: The committee met and discussed ideas on how to proceed with being disciples. The committee recommended that Pastor proceed with forming a "huddle" group to further discuss actions. There was also discussion on what could be done to aid in mental health issues in the community.

#### Old Business:

There is a sizeable increase in the assessed value of the property which will affect the property insurance premium. David and George are to review increased costs with Adair County Mutual, and to review definition of replacement value and what replacement would mean. They were also instructed to obtain a second estimate for insurance costs for a comparison, Respectfully submitted, both for review at the next council meeting.

New Business:

- The council reviewed the contract for organ tuning and approved the increase in price and added additional personnel and Iris Westphal as contact information.
- First guarter benevolence was reviewed by Dan Berg. Gini Herr moved, seconded by Rhonda Boehm to move forward with payment. Carried
- George Feazell reported on a discussion with a carillon company from Cleveland, OH about repair work to the carillon bells. The first step is to check the wiring continuity connecting the speakers and the controller. Once wiring is verified or corrected, the next step is for the company to repair or prepare an estimate for a new controller. Council consensus was to move ahead with repair work using funds from the designated CD.
- George presented a request to update the accounting software. The current software is no longer offered at an annual price. Iris Westphal moved, seconded by Roger Jensen, to keep the Pro Plus software and change to a subscription pricing plan. Approved. Funding from the approved General Admin budget.
- George presented the need for replacing computers for our bookkeeper, secretary, and Pastor. Roger Jensen moved that George purchase 3 new computers and a maintenance contract. Seconded by Rhonda Boehm and carried. Funding from the approved General Admin budget.
- Pastor requested that some of his vacation days be transferred to sick days. After discussion, the council agreed that he should just use vacation days to supplement sick days when the sick days have been used.
- Pastor has been asked to provide suggestions for uses of memorial funds that can then be provided to families as needed. The council will contribute ideas at the next council meeting.

Pastor reviewed his March report. Gini Herr moved, seconded by Dan Berg, to approve his report and expenses. Carried. Pastor presented the continuing discussion on "How to disciple" and devotions from 1<sup>st</sup> John Chapter 2 with discussion on how we should "walk" as Jesus did.

Roger Jensen made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:45 pm, seconded by Samantha Gettler. Motion carried.

President Huff then opened a closed session of the council for review of Pastor's salary. Samantha Gettler moved to proceed with the recommended increase, seconded by Craig Plymesser and approved.

Roger Jensen made a motion to end the closed session, seconded by Dan Berg. Carried

President Huff closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer at 7:15
