FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The month of May is a busy month in the church. We are celebrating Mother's Day, Senior Recognition and Confirmation on the Day of Pentecost. At the same time, many of our families are also celebrating Graduation for their high school seniors. Sometimes in the middle of very busy times, we don't feel able to focus our time on God as much. There doesn't seem to be enough time to do our devotions, or pray or even come to church.

However, I want to encourage you to prepare yourself for this busy time by making God MORE a part of your life rather than less. In the gospel of Matthew chapter 6, Jesus asks, "Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?" And yet how much of our lives do we spend worrying about all that is coming and how we are going to handle it? Jesus explains that God knows that we need food and clothes and all the other things necessary to live. But He also insists that we are to "Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well." Instead of focusing your energy trying to deal with everything yourself, why not focus your energy on making sure that you seek God's presence in the middle of it all. Trust that God will provide enough time, enough money and enough energy for you to do all that is necessary.

In Matthew 8, The disciples were in a boat when suddenly a furious storm came up and waves swept over the boat. They were afraid that they were going to drown so they woke Jesus up who then calmed the storm. Consider that no matter how stressful the days become in your life, God is there with you. He has the power to calm the storm. Yet, if He doesn't immediately make everything better, then maybe you don't need to be as worried either. In the book of Daniel, Daniel was tossed into a den of lions because He refused to back down from worshipping God. But it wasn't just him and the lions down in there. Daniel said, "My God sent His angel and He shut the mouths of the lions." Scripture says "no wound was found on him because he had trusted in His God." There will be times when you are surrounded by people who do not like you and it's very easy to focus on that danger and those unhappy people; however, you might also choose to focus instead on God who is always at your side in the good times and bad times.

In the book of Exodus, when the Egyptians were chasing after the Israelites and they were facing the Red Sea, God told Moses, "The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still." God told Moses to raise his staff and stretch his hand over the sea and the waters parted so that the Israelites could walk across on dry ground. No amount of worrying on Moses' part or amount on work on his part would have created the solution that God had in mind. When you are facing an impossible situation, it is a great time to do less and believe more in a God who can do impossible things!

Martin Luther once said that when he knew that he was about to have a very busy day, he would wake up extra early in the morning to pray since he knew he was going to need the extra help. As you prepare for the busy times coming up next month, I encourage you to make a plan to keep your eyes fixed on Jesus. To stay connected to Him from morning through to the evening and keep your heart and mind focused on how He is working right there beside you. He doesn't abandon us during difficult times; in fact, that's when He is the closest to us. Amen.

E.L.C. COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES— MARCH 10, 2024

The regular council meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Roger Jensen. Present: Iris Westphal, Gini Herr, Roger Jensen, Rhonda Boehm, Louise Johnson, Raedeen Bigelow, Judy Albers, John Baudler, George Feazell and Pastor Steven Broers. Visitor present Denise Bridges.

The agenda was amended to include salary consideration for Denise Bridges and evaluation process for Pastor on motion by Iris Westphal and seconded by Rhonda Boehm. Motion carried.

Pastor Broers led devotions from the *Experiencing God* Bible Study.

Iris Westphal moved to approve the secretary's minutes from the previous February 18th meeting and organizational meeting and John Baudler seconded the motion. Motion carried. Copies of the approved minutes will be available at the church for review as well as the monthly newsletter.

George Feazell presented the treasurer's report for the month of February. Motion to approve the treasurer's report was made by Raedeen Bigelow and seconded by Iris Westphal. Motion carried.

Pastor presented his Ministry Report, Expense Report and LCMC/ NV Ministerial reports. Gini Herr moved to approve Pastor's expense report and Rhonda Boehm seconded the motion. Motion carried. There were no emergency benevolence requests.

Ministry Reports presented:

Children's Ministry report was given by Denise Bridges and can be reviewed in the newsletter.

The Memorial committee is reviewing ideas for church improvements and is open to suggestions.

Louise Johnson moved to approve Ministry reports presented and Raedeen Bigelow seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Old Business:

Rhonda Boehm updated the council on the Carilion project. The donor family was contacted and the funds can be used for improvements to the Carilion/bells at the church. The CD at FNB Bank is \$31,708.28 currently and will mature 8-19-24. George Feazell will provide the contact information of the company to Rhonda for this project.

The council discussed the Church Doctor Proposal. General consensus was to contact Pastor Jon Rollefson, Iowa District LCMC Resolution Coach to see if he would be able to offer similar training.

New Business:

President Jensen encouraged council members to review the Church constitution Chapter 9 and noted the many improvements Pastor Broers has made on items in the Council Resolution.

Council would like to remind everyone the church's policy on no open containers in the sanctuary.

President Jensen distributed information compiled by Denise Bridges on Youth Ministry Program directors and church secretary compensation. Denise proposed combining both positions and a salary amount. Denise Bridges left the meeting. Council discussed the proposal. Louise Johnson moved to make a salaried offer to be effective April 1st and Judy Albers seconded the motion and the motion carried. Pastor Broers will present the offer to Denise.

President Jensen proposed a change in the timing of Pastor and Denise's annual evaluation to be done in the month that salaries are reviewed which will be April. General consensus was to match the evaluation with the salary review month.

Judy Albers enjoyed the hymns played by the bell choir and encouraged members to restart the bell choir.

Next council meeting April 10th will begin at 4:30 p.m.

President Roger Jensen moved to adjourn the meeting and John Baudler seconded the motion and it carried.

President Jensen closed the meeting with the Lord's prayer at 6:50 p.m.
