FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"I form the light and create darkness, I bring prosperity and create disaster; I, the Lord, do all true. It is hard as a person of faith to accept these things." Isaiah 45:7

As I write this newsletter article, I remember four days ago when our faith community at Emmanuel was gathered together at one combined service to celebrate the affirmation of faith confessed by four young men at their confirmation. They declared their faith before our congregation, their families gathered around them to pray for the Holy Spirit to fill their hearts and guide their lives and we shared holy communion as a community. It was a day of great blessing and celebration!

That same afternoon, just a few hours later, our wider community celebrated another momentous occasion as we gathered together at the High School and watched our senior class receive their diplomas and begin the next step in their journey into adulthood. There were smiles all around as we took pictures of the graduates in their robes and enjoyed eating cake and goodies at various graduation parties around the town. It was a sunny day full of hope and joy!

Two days later, only two days ago from when I am writing this article, a part of our community, the city of Greenfield, was devastated by a tornado. One-hundred and fiftythree houses were either destroyed or suffered major damage including nine owned by our own faith community members. There were five fatalities. In one minute, the town that had been a place of celebration only two days earlier had become a place of tragedy. Young and old were affected. People of faith and people of brings light out of darkness and life out of no faith were affected. There was no rhyme or reason to the destruction.

Why did this happen? I don't know. Scripture does not give us good answers as to why such an awful event occurred. But the prophet Isaiah tells us this: "I form the light and create darkness, I bring prosperity and create disaster; I, the Lord, do all these things." It is

difficult to hear these words and yet they are that a God who loves us would allow such a terrible disaster to affect our town and our loved ones. It makes no sense! And yet, to confess anything else would not honor God as the creator of heaven and earth. If God is truly God then He alone must have a say in every blessing we experience as well as every natural disaster we endure.

When we experience God in this devastating way, Martin Luther called it experiencing the "Hidden God". We know that God is at work, but we do not know why He would allow such a thing! His love is hidden from us. However, these experiences often lead us to seek God as He chooses to reveal Himself, that is, in the person of Jesus Christ. For in Jesus, we experience the "Revealed God" who loves us, died for us and promises to be with us through every good and bad moment of life.

I do not know why this tornado came and hurt so many people. I do not know why this tornado brought so much pain and suffering to so many people. But I do know this: Jesus loves you and loves all of those who are walking in the shadow of death. Jesus is suffering right along with those who lost everything for He knows those feelings of loss and death. He even understands that you or the people around you may be angry at God for allowing this to happen; Jesus knows those feelings of abandonment and betrayal. And yet He promises to hold you close and to bring life and resurrection out of death and destruction. He death.

I hope that you put your trust in Jesus through this time of difficulty and know that God is with you even during the worst of circumstances. For while God hides Himself in the tragedies of the world, He also reveals Himself in Jesus Christ who died for your sins and was raised for your justification. Amen.




Congratulations and Praise to this years class of young men. They shared their faith talks with the congregation on May 19th.




