FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As I was praying about what to write about this that interested in calming the storm . . . He just month, I kept hearing the phrase "weather the storm" pop into my head. But when I think about faith. I must admit that "weather the storm" doesn't seem very exciting. I mean, consider some of the most popular stories about faith in the Bible. In the book of Esther, Esther risks her life by asking the King to save her people from being annihilated. In the story of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednago these three men are thrown into the fiery furnace because they refuse to bow down to the statue of King Nebuchadnezzar. In the New Testament, a woman who has been suffering physically for twelve long years reaches out within a crowd to touch the hem of Jesus' robe and is healed instantly due to her faith. Those are pretty inspiring stories of faith!

"Weathering the storm" might not seem very exciting or inspiring, but it is still an important part of your faith life. You can't always stand up to giants like David did with Goliath. There won't always be someone to argue with about your faith like Paul did in the book of Acts. But there will always be storms in your life. How do you keep your faith when everything is going crazy around you? I want you to read the story of Jesus calming the storm from Mark chapter 4 and ask yourself this question: how did Jesus deal with the storm?

"A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke Him and said to Him, Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" He got up. rebuked the wind and said to the waves. 'Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. He said to His disciples, Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

In the past, when I have read this story, I guess I thought that Jesus showed His strength of faith because He calmed the storm. But then I realized that Jesus wasn't really all

did it to show the disciples that He cared for them. Jesus would have been fine just sleeping through the storm. Jesus had the power to calm the storm, obviously, but He was also good just waiting until the storm had passed. He had faith to "weather the storm".

The last few weeks have been characterized by a series of storms in our lives here in lowa. Lots and lots of snow, sleet, ice and wind have pummeled our houses and our cars. We had to even cancel in-person church services because things were so dangerous! Would it have been a great example of faith to get in our cars and travel to church that Sunday morning? Maybe. But faith doesn't always involve risking your life or standing up to the forces of evil. Sometimes faith means simply trusting that God is with us, Emmanuel, while the storms rage around us. Sometimes faith is about bundling up and waiting for the trouble around us to calm down on its own.

When you start to notice, there are many scripture passages that show us that faith is about simply weathering the storms of our lives and trusting that God loves us even while they rage around us:

"The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still." Exodus 14:14

"This is what the Lord says to you: 'Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's. You will not have to fight this battle. Take up your positions; stand firm and see the deliverance the LORD will give you."2 Chronicles 15b,

"Have mercy on me, my God, have mercy on me, for in you I take refuge. I will take refuge in the shadow of your wings until the disaster has passed." Psalm 57:1

The regular council meeting was called to order at 5:02 p.m. by Vice President Dan Berg. Present: Rhonda Boehm, Samantha Gettler, Iris Westphal, Gini Herr, Craig Plymesser, Dan Berg, Roger Jensen, Louise Johnson, and Pastor Steve Broers.

Guests: George Feazell, Denise Bridges

Pastor Broers presented the devotions from John 17, 22-23: Finding unity in Jesus. He also encouraged council members to bring their Bible to the next council meeting.

Motion to approve minutes as distributed was made by Rhonda Boehm and seconded by Roger Jensen. Motion carried. Motion to approve the treasurer's report as mailed made by Roger Jensen and seconded by Louise Johnson. Motion carried. There were no requests for emergency benevolence funds. Motion to approve Pastor's written report and expenses as mailed, and updated by Gini Herr, seconded by Samantha Gettler. Motion carried.

Stewardship letters were mailed and should be received by Friday, December 15. If you haven't received a letter, please let Barb Lemke know. We don't have an updated address for you. The property committee plans to present an updated estimate for the parsonage cabinets at our annual meeting, order cabinets in the fall of 2024 for installation in the spring of 2025 following successful fund raising.

New Business:

1. Dan Berg read the resignation letter from David Huff.

Rhonda Boehm motioned to accept David Huff's resignation as President and from the council with regret, 2nd by Iris Westphal. Motioned carried.

Gini Herr motioned that we accept Dan Berg as President to fill the vacancy created by the resignation, and to be able to sign checks and carry out council business. 2nd by Rhonda Boehm. Motion carried.

- 2. George Feazell reviewed an amended proposed budget for 2024 for \$240,110.25. Lengthy discussion followed on how to balance with proposed income. It was suggested that the line items for Building, Equipment and Maintenance be split into two lines, one for church proper and one for parsonage. It was agreed to delay further discussion until final numbers are available for 2023. The budget does not include any funds for capital improvements.
- 3. George Feazell presented proposed benevolence giving based on estimated income for the 4th quarter so that a check could be written in 4th quarter rather than 1st quarter 2024. There was

consensus to move ahead with the proposed benevolence. The benevolence could then be "trued up" after final numbers come in. It was also proposed to give a donation from Emergency Benevolence to Pastor Kyle Fever's family (Good Shepherd Lutheran in Adair, IA) for aid in medical bills for his daughter. The amount will be discussed at the January council meeting. There was discussion on an amount to contribute to the lowa District LCMC. Craig Plymesser motioned to give \$200.00 for 4th quarter 2023, and to give \$200.00 per quarter in 2024, 2nd by Samantha Gettler, carried.

4. Pastor reviewed activities and news from LCMC, LCMC Iowa District, and the Nodaway Valley Ministerial Association. LCMC Three Days of Prayer on January 2-4 – (Information taken from LCMC's website)

LCMC National Youth Gathering - **July 9-12, 2024,** at **Grand View University** (Information taken from LCMC's website)

Dates coincide with the Adair County Fair

Iowa District meeting of LCMC in Badger, Iowa on Saturday, November 11th. This year, there was a really great speaker named Jordan Biere who is the National Youth Director for Alpha USA. Jordan explained that the challenges we are facing are much different than in previous generations.

The Nodaway Valley Ministerial Association met at noon on Wednesday, November 8th. Pastor Broers reported that there was \$717.11 currently in the account to help needy people and families.

The group discussed holding another 5th Quarter even for Middle school and High school students at The Gathering Place 5. Pastor presented an outline for 2024 sermons and readings 6. Evaluation forms for Pastor Broers were handed out. Discussion followed as to how to improve the evaluation process. It was agreed that the form should use a number system of 1 – 5 instead of 1 – 3. All were strongly encouraged to include written comments. The form will be due back to President Berg by January 1 for discussion at the January 14th council meeting. Rather than compile a summary sheet, copies from everyone will be distributed to all without names attached.

- 7. There was not an official nominating committee report, but it was known that 2 have volunteered to have their name on the ballot
- 8. The ELC Annual meeting will be held **Sunday**, **January 21**, **2024**, **at 9:30 am** (between services). Ministry teams and all other committee/group reports will be **due January 7** to the Church secretary. Gini Herr volunteered to do "financial review" on "other committee/group" financials for increased transparency if they would include their December bank statement with their report. Printed hard copy annual reports will be available January 14, and emailed to those on the newsletter email list. Financials will be a handout at the annual meeting. George will facilitate a financial review committee to review the financials.
- 9. New church stewardship envelopes will be available in everyone's box by December 24, 2023.
- 10. Denise reviewed deadlines for submitting agenda items and reports for council meetings. Financial info would be available the Friday before the meeting allowing the latest information from bank statements.






We are looking for places for a total of 20 people to stay during that time. There will be 11 adults (Pastor Matti, six women, two married couples) and 9 teenagers, all girls.
